Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 5, 2023

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in year ended March 31, 2023 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks capital growth and income by investing primarily in a combination of equities and fixed income securities of issuers located anywhere in the world. Depending on economic conditions and relative valuations by the Fund's portfolio managers, the Fund will generally invest 30% to 70% of its assets in each of equity and fixed income securities, but may invest up to 100% of its assets in either asset class. The Fund follows an approach to investing that focuses on sustainable and responsible issuers.

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for medium-term investors looking for a global balanced fund that invests in companies focused on socially responsible investing to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock and bond markets, and who have a low to medium tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series A securities returned -5.3%, and Series LB securities returned -5.4% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of -2.5% for a blended index composed of a 50% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index (returned 0.2%), and a 50% weighting in the ICE BofA Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index (returned -5.4%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equities fell over the period as economic forecasts weakened, although currency movements generally boosted returns in Canadian dollar terms. Employment remained strong. In response to persistently high inflation, the U.S. Federal Reserve and the European Central Bank increased their policy rates significantly. Higher interest rates contributed to a crisis in the U.S. banking system

in March. In fixed income, global yields rose sharply. Volatility in fixed income markets was heightened by the magnitude of central bank policy actions and by geopolitical tensions.

Within the MSCI AC (All Country) World (Net) Index, Turkey, Greece and Denmark were the strongest-performing markets in Canadian dollar terms, while Colombia, the United Arab Emirates and Qatar were the weakest. The energy, consumer staples and industrials sectors were the strongest performers, while real estate, communication services and consumer discretionary were the weakest.

The following discussion reflects the Fund's allocation decisions and the activities and performance of its underlying investment funds and other directly held securities. The Fund underperformed both the broad-based index and the blended index because of the performance of its equity portfolio. The fixed income portfolio outperformed the fixed income portion of the blended index. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

Within the equity portion of the Fund, stock selection in the United States and Denmark detracted from performance. In sector terms, stock selection in consumer staples and utilities detracted from performance. Conversely, stock selection in the United Kingdom contributed to performance, as did an overweight position and stock selection in Italy. In sector terms, stock selection in consumer discretionary contributed to performance, as did an overweight position and stock selection in industrials.

Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, security selection among foreign government bonds and corporate bonds in the securitization sector detracted from performance. Conversely, a shorter duration (lower sensitivity to interest rates) contributed to performance as interest rates rose. Security selection among corporate bonds in the financial sector also contributed to performance.

Over the period, the Fund's exposure to fixed income increased as the outlook for fixed income markets improved and the Fund's asset allocation mix returned to neutral from a previous overweight exposure to equities. Within the equity portfolio, exposure to the information technology sector decreased in response to market volatility. Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, exposure to higher-quality investment grade corporate bonds was increased in response to economic uncertainty.

Environmental, Social and Governance ("ESG") Impact

Engagement and stewardship (identified as the fourth "A" – for advocacy – in the equity portfolio management team's investment process) are a primary part of the team's philosophy. During the period, for example, the team engaged with Darling Ingredients Inc., a company that creates sustainable food, feed and fuel ingredients for the food, sports nutrition, animal feed, pet food, cosmetic, biofuel, fertilizer and pharmaceutical industries. The company's ESG profile rests on three pillars: reducing waste, reclaiming proteins to reinsert into the food economy and creating sustainable fuel.

The equity team discussed the opportunities and challenges of sustainable aviation fuel ("SAF") with respect to the leadership position Darling retains with its Diamond Green Diesel renewable diesel refinery. The U.S. administration has set an ambitious goal and opportunity for the industry to reduce aviation emissions by 20% by 2030 through SAF production.

The equity team engaged companies on several key themes: diversity in overall company profile, senior management and board members; carbon footprint reduction; human rights; plastic solutions, such as reducing plastic in packaging; banks and the environment, specifically in lending practices to carbon-heavy industries; and improvement of company disclosures on ESG issues. Over the period, the equity team conducted 44 engagements with 35 companies held in the portfolio. The team had 21 engagements on diversity, the highest of any theme.

The fixed income portfolio management team considers a variety of factors when looking to invest in ESG-labelled debt, which generally falls into four main buckets: green bonds, social bonds, sustainable bonds and sustainability-linked bonds.

These factors include the ability to link the impact of a project to a specific bond, the issuer's detailed description of funded projects and annual performance updates, the issuer's use of an "impact calculation" based on evident and clear methodology, allocation or "use of proceeds" reporting that meets the team's standards, and the bond's alignment with various United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

A significant addition to the fixed income portfolio over the period was the inaugural green bond from the Government of New Zealand (4.25%, 05-15-2034), which will finance transition themes such as clean transport, energy efficiency, renewable energy, green buildings, living and natural resources, and land use. The country's Green Bond Framework supports the continued financing of the environmental objectives highlighted in New Zealand's 2022–2025 Emission Reduction Plan. Further, the framework highlights the importance of an intersectional approach to sustainability, emphasizing the role of traditional Maori (Indigenous) philosophies and leadership in the country's environmental and economic transition to net zero. New Zealand is a leader in ESG factors according to the fixed income team's sovereign sustainability models.

As higher-quality labelled debt was issued over the period, the team gradually moved more of the fixed income portfolio into these types of debt securities. Green bonds increased to 48% of the Fund's fixed income investments from 40%, sustainable bonds increased to 14% from 11%, and sustainability-linked bonds increased to 9% from 6%, while exposure to social bonds remained at 1%.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets decreased by 12.6% during the period to \$78.2 million. This change was composed primarily of \$4.3 million in net losses (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$7.0 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the year ended March 31, 2023, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2022. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MER for Series D decreased due to a decrease in the management fee rate effective April 4, 2022, as noted in the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of the report. The MER for Series T5 increased due to changes in its applicable Harmonized Sales Tax rate. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The equity portfolio management team welcomes a new and unified regulatory plan for the United States that will formalize the rules for company disclosures regarding social and environmental responsibility. The team also favours rules under consideration by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission to increase transparency by enhancing reporting of proxy votes, which is already part of the team's practice. In the team's view, although earnings expectations in many sectors should be reduced, improved global manufacturing indicators in early 2023 were encouraging. The team believes that the reopening of the Chinese economy may boost demand for goods.

The fixed income portfolio management team expects volatility and uncertainty in fixed income markets to continue for the rest of 2023. The team believes that the U.S. Federal Reserve could pause rate increases in 2023, while rate cuts are unlikely as long as the global economy is resilient and inflation remains elevated. In Europe, the team believes rates should rise further in response to continuing higher core inflation. The team continues to focus on both ESG-labelled bonds and best-in-class ESG issuers to maximize impact.

Effective March 31, 2023, KPMG LLP was appointed as the auditor of the Fund.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

At March 31, 2023, Mackenzie had an investment of \$0.03 million in the Fund (less than 0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

The Manager relied on an approval provided by the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee to appoint KPMG LLP as the auditor of the Fund, effective March 31, 2023.

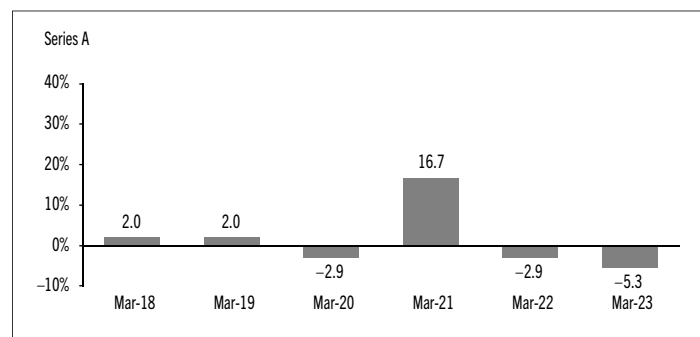
Past Performance

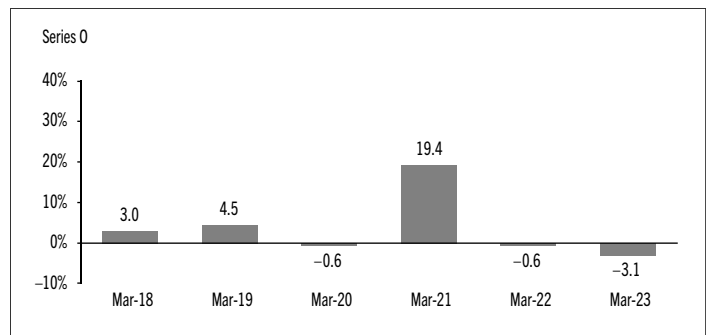
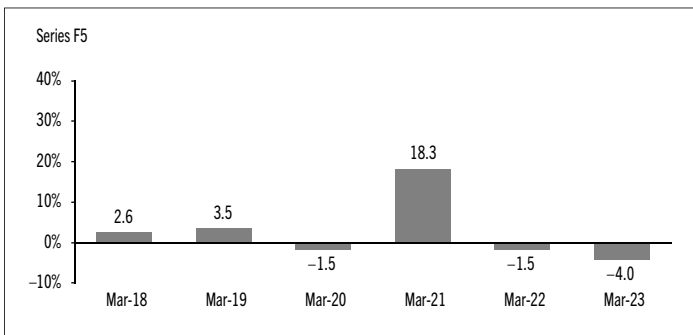
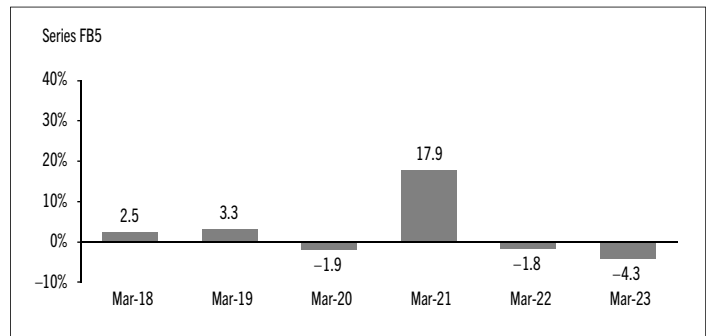
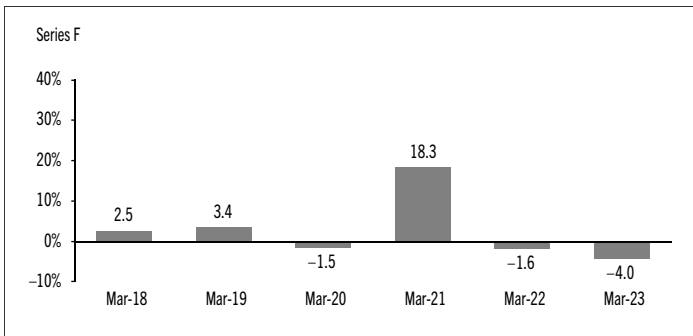
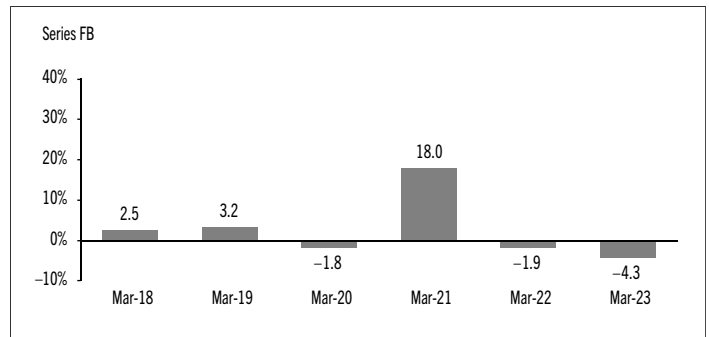
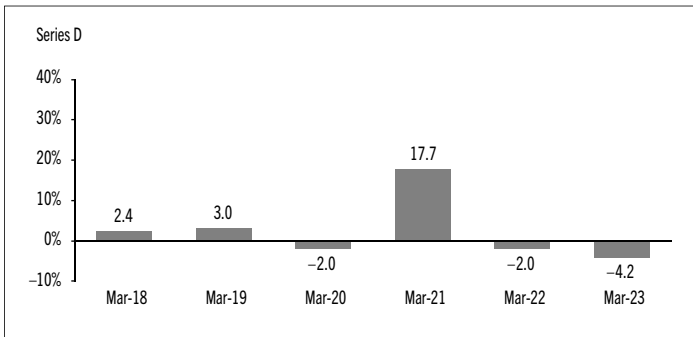
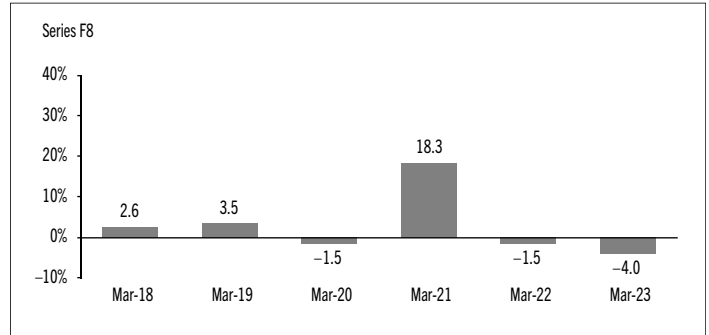
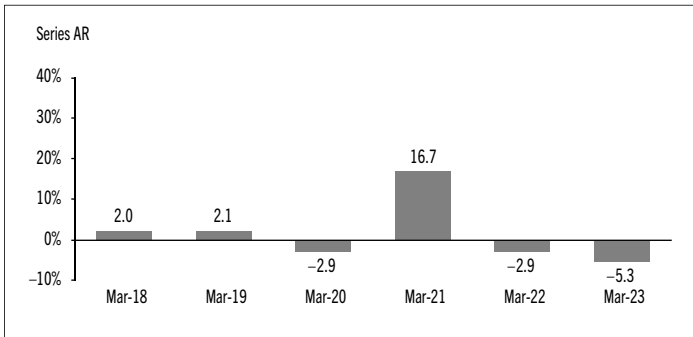
Year-by-Year Returns

The ICE BofA Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index tracks the performance of investment grade debt publicly issued in major domestic and eurobond markets, including sovereign, quasi-government, corporate, securitized and collateralized securities. Qualifying bonds must be rated "BBB" or higher and have a remaining term to maturity of at least one year. The foreign currency exposure is hedged to the Canadian dollar.

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

LBC Financial Services Inc. ("LBC") is the principal distributor for the LBC series securities of the Fund (as listed under *Fund Formation and Series Information*) and receives a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to the Manager. Under this arrangement, LBC was entitled to approximately 25% of the total management fees that the Manager received from the LBC series of all Mackenzie funds during the period. The Manager is responsible for paying all distribution-related payments to LBC-authorized dealers whose clients invest in the LBC series of the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 31% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.

Series AR securities are offered to retail investors in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie.

Series D securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500 through a discount brokerage or other account approved by Mackenzie.

Series F, Series F5 and Series F8 securities are offered to investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$500 (\$5,000 for Series F5 and Series F8); they are also available to employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries, and directors of Mackenzie.
