Management Discussion of Fund Performance

July 13, 2020

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments during the year ended March 31, 2020 (the "period"), that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook. If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period from inception to the end of the fiscal period. For information on the Fund's longer-term performance, as applicable, please refer to the *Past Performance* section of the report. In this report, "Mackenzie" refers to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks income with potential long-term capital growth by investing substantially all of its assets in Mackenzie Private Income Balanced Pool (the "Underlying Fund"), which invests mainly in Canadian fixed income and income-oriented equities and utilizes multiple portfolio management teams with a mix of investing styles. The Underlying Fund's asset mix will generally range between 45%–75% equities and 25%–55% fixed income securities. It may hold up to 45% of its assets in foreign investments. The Underlying Fund diversifies in terms of geographic exposure, sector exposure, company market capitalization, portfolio manager style, credit quality and duration.

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for medium-term investors looking for a Canadian income-oriented balanced fund to hold as a key part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock and bond markets, and who have a low to medium tolerance for risk. The Fund is not available for registered plans.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of the Fund's Series PW and Series LW securities is discussed below. The performance of all series is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Where series returns differ, it is primarily because different levels of fees and expenses were charged to each series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series.

During the period, the Fund's Series PW and Series LW securities returned –6.4% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of –4.9% for a blended index composed of a 50% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the S&P/TSX Composite Index (returned –14.2%), and a 50% weighting in the FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index (returned 4.5%). All index and series returns are calculated on

a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equity markets, including Canada's, rallied strongly into February despite weakening economic data, then fell sharply in March in response to the worldwide health measures put into place to mitigate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Crude oil prices declined markedly in response to global production increases and lower demand due to the pandemic. In March, the Bank of Canada made emergency policy rate cuts, as did the U.S. Federal Reserve after three earlier reductions of the federal funds rate. Government bond prices rose as yields declined over the period, while corporate bond prices fell. A weaker Canadian dollar late in the period boosted returns for Canadian investors.

Within the S&P/TSX Composite Index, information technology, utilities and communication services were the strongest sectors, while health care, energy and consumer discretionary were the weakest.

The following discussion reflects the Underlying Fund's allocation decisions and the activities and performance of its underlying investment funds and other directly held securities. The Fund outperformed the broad-based index because of its allocation to fixed income, which outperformed equities in the period. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund underperformed the blended index, with holdings in term loans and corporate bonds detracting from performance.

Within the equity portion of the Fund, stock selection in the health care sector contributed to performance, as did an underweight position in the energy sector and exposure to alternative assets and gold. In geographic terms, holdings in the United States and Germany contributed, as did stock selection in Canada. Conversely, stock selection in the materials and utilities sectors detracted from performance, as did holdings in India.

Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, holdings in high-yield bonds detracted from performance, while duration positioning within government bonds and security selection among U.S. government bonds contributed to performance.

The Fund's foreign currency exposure is actively managed to help mitigate risk and take advantage of opportunities at the total portfolio level. During the period, currency activities contributed to absolute performance primarily because of exposure to the U.S. dollar as the U.S. dollar appreciated relative to the Canadian dollar.

Over the period, the Fund's exposure to fixed income increased, as exposure to foreign government bonds increased. Exposure to equities decreased due to market effect.

Net Assets

The Fund's NAV declined by 3.6% to \$104.9 million at March 31, 2020, from \$108.8 million at March 31, 2019. This change was composed primarily of \$6.7 million in net losses (after including dividend and interest income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, \$3.8 million in net sales, and \$1.0 million in cash distributions.

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Fees and Expenses

The management expense ratio (“MER”) for Series PW of 1.92% during the year ended March 31, 2020, was slightly lower than the MER of 1.93% for the year ended March 31, 2019. The MER for Series LW of 2.02% during the year ended March 31, 2020, was slightly lower than the annualized MER of 2.03% for the period ended March 31, 2019. The MERs (before and after waivers or absorptions, if any) for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report. The MER for Series PWT8 decreased due to a decrease in fund costs.

Recent Developments

Governments worldwide have enacted emergency measures to combat the spread of the COVID-19 virus in the last several months. These measures have caused significant volatility and weakness in global equity markets and material disruption to businesses globally, resulting in an economic slowdown. Governments and central banks have reacted with significant monetary and fiscal interventions designed to stabilize economic conditions.

The duration and impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on businesses and markets, and the extent of economic relief measures provided by governments and central banks, are unknown at the reporting date and it is therefore not possible to reliably estimate the impact on the financial results and position of the Fund in future periods.

On July 19, 2019, Nelson Arruda of the Mackenzie Multi-Asset Strategies team assumed responsibility from Alain Bergeron for the asset mix of the Fund and the Underlying Fund.

The team believes slowing the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic came at a steep economic cost, and expects sharp contractions in gross domestic product globally. To combat this, major central banks have moved to ease rates and improve liquidity in a number of markets, while governments have announced fiscal packages of unprecedented size to support households and businesses.

Looking ahead, the team believes the macro outlook relates mainly to the duration of the economic lockdown and the pace of reopening of economies. The team expects the speed of the economic recovery to depend critically on the prevention of business failures so that unemployed workers can quickly return to work, allowing income and production to normalize. The team expects bond yields to remain low until economies return to a more normal state, while equity market volatility may continue.

On September 27, 2019, underlying fund Mackenzie Canadian Large Cap Dividend Fund was renamed Mackenzie Canadian Dividend Fund.

Related Party Transactions

The following arrangements result in fees paid by the Fund to Mackenzie or to companies affiliated with the Fund.

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to Mackenzie at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, Mackenzie pays

all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

At March 31, 2020, Mackenzie had an investment of \$4,969 in the Fund (less than 0.1% of the Fund’s NAV).

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds’ Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions.

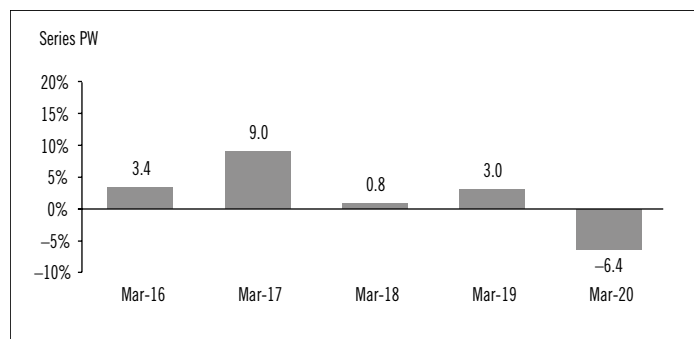
Past Performance

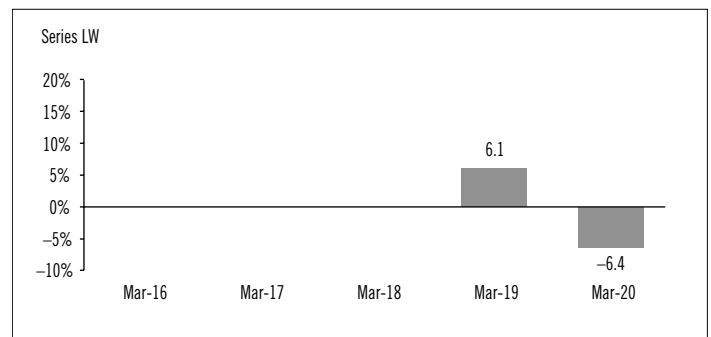
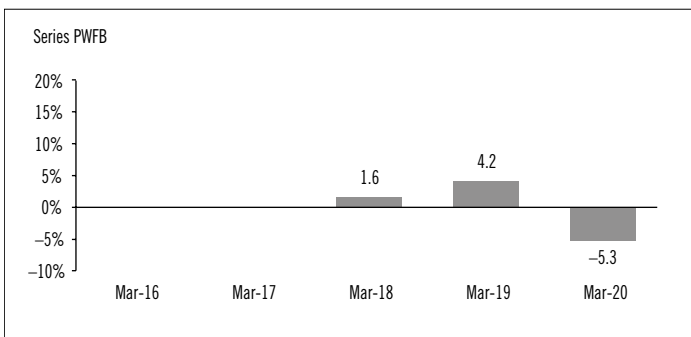

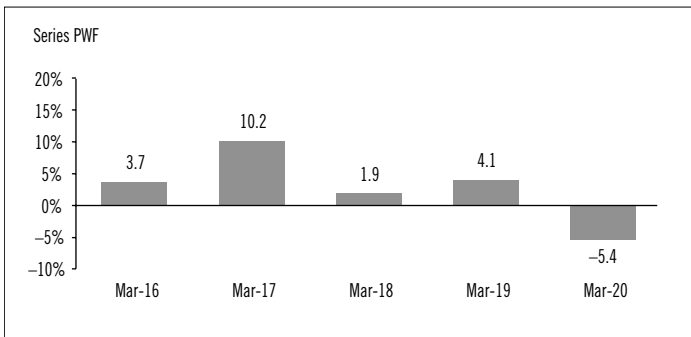

The FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index is a broad measure of Canadian bonds with terms to maturity of more than one year. It includes federal, provincial, municipal and corporate bonds rated "BBB" or higher.

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Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by Mackenzie to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. Mackenzie also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

LBC Financial Services Inc. ("LBC") is the principal distributor for the LBC series securities of the Fund (as listed under *Fund Formation and Series Information*) and receives a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to Mackenzie. Under this arrangement, LBC was entitled to approximately 23% of the total management fees that Mackenzie received from the LBC series of all Mackenzie funds during the year. Mackenzie is responsible for paying all distribution-related payments to LBC-authorized dealers whose clients invest in the LBC series of the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with Mackenzie may be entitled to distribution-related payments from Mackenzie on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

Mackenzie used approximately 43% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the year to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 34% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the year. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.

Series PWF and Series PWF8 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$100,000. Investors in Series PWF and Series PWF8 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 4% or 8% per year, respectively.

Series PWFB securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWFB securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 4% per year.

Series LW securities are offered through our Preferred Pricing Program to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors in Series LW securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 4% per year.

An investor in the Fund may choose among different purchase options that are available under each series. These purchase options are a sales charge purchase option and a no-load purchase option. The charges under the sales charge purchase option are negotiated by investors with their dealers. Not all purchase options are available under each series of the Fund, and the charges for each purchase option may vary among the different series.
