Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 4, 2026

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the year ended March 31, 2026 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The Fund seeks to provide regular income and preserve capital, over a predetermined time period, by investing primarily in a portfolio of investment grade Canadian dollar- and U.S. dollar-denominated corporate bonds with an effective maturity in 2029. It is anticipated that the Fund will terminate on or about November 30, 2029. The Fund currently invests all its assets in Mackenzie Target 2029 North American IG Corporate Bond ETF (the "Underlying ETF").

Risk

The risks of the Fund remain as discussed in the Fund's most recent Simplified Prospectus.

The Fund is suitable for short-term investors looking for North American investment grade corporate bonds with a target maturity date to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of bond markets and who have a low tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

Investment performance is not presented because the Fund has not issued securities for the full 12-month period.

Net Assets

From its inception on May 1, 2025, to March 31, 2026, the Fund experienced \$0.006 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$0.2 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

At March 31, 2026, 11.7% of the Fund's NAV was held by investors that individually owned 10% or more of the Fund. As a result, the Fund is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Fund's most recent Simplified Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions. At March 31, 2026, Mackenzie had received no such notices.

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended March 31, 2026, is presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

In the view of the portfolio management team of the Underlying ETF, the evolving debate about U.S. Federal Reserve independence and the potential appointment of a new chair has introduced additional uncertainty about monetary policy. The team believes that structural trends, rising geopolitical tensions and renewed trade friction have complicated the investment backdrop. In this environment, the team maintains a neutral stance on duration positioning (sensitivity to changes in interest rates). The team believes that sustained high oil prices may prompt investors to shift their focus away from inflation in favour of the impact of energy prices on global economic growth. Consequently, the team is moving toward a growth-over-inflation investment approach.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the most recent Simplified Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

At March 31, 2026, Mackenzie had an investment of \$0.2 million in the Fund (80.4% of the Fund's NAV). If Mackenzie decides to redeem its investment, it will do so in accordance with securities law and in a manner that reduces the possibility of adverse effects on the Fund.

During the period, the Fund received \$0.001 million in income distributions from investments in exchange-traded funds ("ETFs") managed by Mackenzie to offset fees paid within those ETFs. There is no assurance that these distributions will continue in the future.

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

Past Performance

Past performance is not presented because the Fund has not issued securities for the full 12-month period.

- (2) Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, income taxes and withholding taxes, for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period, except as noted. In the period a series is established, the MER is annualized from the date of inception to the end of the period. Where the Fund directly invests in securities of another fund (including exchange-traded funds or "ETFs"), the MERs presented for the Fund include the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.
- (3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the Fund invests in securities of another fund (including ETFs), the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment.
- (4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the Fund is less than one year old. The value of any trades to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, is excluded from the portfolio turnover rate.

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

IG Wealth Management Inc., a dealer affiliated with the Manager, may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers.

The Manager used approximately 41% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 52% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions paid for that series. The higher proportion of distribution-related payments is primarily attributable to the Fund's higher proportion of assets in series that pay a lower management fee compared to other funds managed by Mackenzie.

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Fund Formation and Series Information

The Fund may have undergone a number of changes, such as a reorganization or a change in manager, mandate or name. A history of the major changes affecting the Fund in the last 10 years can be found in the Fund’s most recent Simplified Prospectus.

Date of Formation: April 16, 2025

The Fund may issue an unlimited number of securities of each series. The number of issued and outstanding securities of each series is disclosed under *Financial Highlights*.

Series A securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500.

Series AR securities are offered to retail investors in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie.

Series D securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500 through a discount brokerage or other account approved by Mackenzie.

Series F are offered to investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$500; they are also available to employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries, and directors of Mackenzie.

Series FB securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor.

An investor may purchase the Fund under a sales charge purchase option and a no-load purchase option. Not all purchase options are available under each series of the Fund. The sales charge under the sales charge purchase option is negotiated by the investor with their dealer. Investors who previously purchased other Mackenzie funds under a redemption charge purchase option may switch to securities of the Fund, under the redemption charge purchase option, until such time as their redemption schedule has expired.
