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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

June 3, 2022

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the ETF's performance and outlook in the year ended March 31, 2022 (the "period"). If the ETF was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the ETF. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the ETF as calculated for subscription and redemption purposes, on which the discussion of ETF performance is based.

Investment Objective and Strategies

The ETF seeks to replicate, to the extent reasonably possible and before fees and expenses, the performance of the TOBAM Maximum Diversification Developed Europe Index, or any successor thereto. It invests primarily in equity securities of developed European markets.

Risk

The risks of the ETF remain as discussed in the ETF's Prospectus.

The ETF is suitable for medium- to long-term investors looking for a European equity fund to hold as part of their portfolio, who can handle the volatility of stock markets and who have a medium tolerance for risk.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

During the period, the ETF returned -4.5% (after deducting fees and expenses). This compares with a return of 3.0% for the ETF's broad-based index, the MSCI Europe (Net) Index, and a return of -3.7% for the ETF's narrow index, the TOBAM Maximum Diversification Developed Europe Index. All index returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

European equities declined over the period, largely in the final three months. Inflation rose to a multi-decade high as the Russian invasion of Ukraine pushed energy prices up amid supply concerns. Bond yields rose, generating expectations that the European Central Bank would tighten monetary policy more quickly than previously forecast to tame surging rates of inflation. Although COVID-19 cases in Europe remained elevated, most countries lifted restrictions, signalling a shift towards treating the virus as endemic.

The ETF's core investment philosophy is to seek enhanced diversification through a balanced exposure to all relevant risk factors in the European equity markets. As a result of this approach, the ETF may have less concentrated risk exposures than those of a market capitalization weighted index, such as the broad-based index.

The ETF underperformed the broad-based index, with stock selection in the United Kingdom, Denmark, Switzerland and France detracting from performance. In sector terms, stock selection in information technology, health care, consumer staples and consumer discretionary detracted from performance, as did an underweight position and stock selection in energy.

Conversely, stock selection in Portugal contributed to performance relative to the broad-based index. In sector terms, stock selection in real estate and financials contributed to performance.

Given the ETF's mandate, the return of the narrow index is a more meaningful comparison. The difference in performance between the ETF and the narrow index resulted primarily from management fees and other operating expenses.

Over the period, changes were made to the ETF's holdings to reflect changes in the composition of the narrow index.

Net Assets

The ETF's net assets decreased by 60.1% during the period to \$13.1 million. This change was composed primarily of \$0.8 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$20.6 million due to net unitholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

At March 31, 2022, 32.8% of the ETF's NAV was held as inventory by the ETF's designated broker primarily for the purpose of sales to investors in the secondary market. As a result of these investments, the ETF is subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the ETF or on its investors, through such processes as settling transactions in kind, charging creation and/or redemption fees for transactions settling in cash, and establishing appropriate order cut-off times for transactions.

Recent Developments

Ongoing uncertainty regarding the duration and long-term impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the effectiveness of vaccines against new variants of the virus contributes to uncertainty regarding the timing of a full economic recovery. As a result, it is not possible to reliably estimate the impact of the pandemic on the financial results and condition of the ETF in future periods.

Because the ETF is an index fund, neither market expectations nor recent developments affect the composition of the portfolio.

Effective September 22, 2021, Atul Tiwari was appointed to the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee.

Related Party Transactions

Management Fees

The management expense ratio ("MER") for the ETF during the year ended March 31, 2022, was similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2021. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in the ETF. The MERs are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report. The ETF paid management fees to the Manager at the annual rate of 0.50%.

The management fee for the ETF is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The ETF's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the ETF, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, providing other services and licensing the index, and to pay for all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs as more fully described in the Prospectus) required to operate the ETF.

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Other Related Party Transactions

The Manager is wholly owned by IGM Financial Inc., which in turn is a subsidiary of Power Corp. of Canada. Companies related to Power Corp. of Canada are therefore considered affiliates of the Manager. At March 31, 2022, the ETF held the following investment(s) in companies affiliated with the Manager: \$0.05 million invested in securities issued by Pernod Ricard SA, \$0.02 million invested in securities issued by SGS SA and \$0.03 million invested in securities issued by Umicore SA. The investment(s) represented 0.8% of the ETF's NAV. In making the investment(s), the Manager relied on the approval of the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee. The Independent Review Committee issued the approval on the basis that the investment(s) would be made in compliance with the Manager's policies. The Manager's policies are designed to ensure that any related party transaction (i) is made free from any influence by an entity related to the Manager and without taking into account any considerations relevant to an entity related to the Manager; (ii) represents the business judgment of the Manager, uninfluenced by considerations other than the best interests of the ETF; and (iii) achieves a fair and reasonable result for the ETF.

Investment funds managed by Mackenzie and its affiliates may invest in the ETF in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At March 31, 2022, funds managed by Mackenzie owned 17.7% of the ETF's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the current market price. As a result of these investments, the ETF may be subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effects on the ETF or on its investors, through such processes as settling transactions in kind, charging creation and/or redemption fees for transactions settling in cash, and establishing appropriate order cut-off time for transactions.

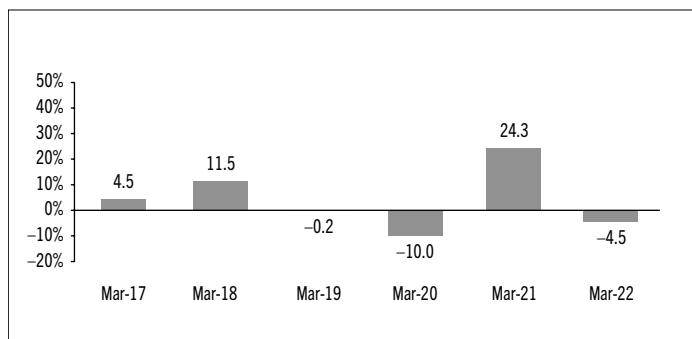
Past Performance

The ETF's past performance information is presented in the following chart and table. It assumes all distributions made by the ETF in the periods presented are reinvested in additional units of the ETF. The chart and table do not take into account brokerage commissions or income taxes payable by any investor that would have reduced returns. The past performance of the ETF is not necessarily an indication of how it will perform in the future.

If you hold this ETF outside of a registered plan, income and capital gains distributions paid to you increase your income for tax purposes whether paid to you in cash or reinvested in additional units of the ETF. Annual Compound Returns

Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in these performance figures.

All index returns are calculated in Canadian dollars on a total return basis, meaning that all dividend payments, interest income accruals and interest payments are reinvested.

The MSCI Europe (Net) Index represents large- and mid-cap equity performance across 15 developed markets in Europe. Net total returns are calculated after the deduction of withholding tax from the foreign income and dividends of its constituents.

The TOBAM Maximum Diversification Developed Europe Index is designed to measure the performance of large- and mid-capitalization equity securities listed in developed European markets that have been selected and weighted to enhance diversification. For periods after February 28, 2019, the returns of the index take into account the deduction of withholding tax from the foreign income and dividends of its constituents. For periods before February 28, 2019, the returns do not take withholding tax into account.

The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.
- The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the ETF invests in securities of another fund (including other ETFs), the TER presented for the ETF includes the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Mackenzie may reimburse the ETF for certain brokerage commissions and other transaction costs (including those payable to the custodian or its agents). Mackenzie may make these reimbursements at its discretion and stop these reimbursements at any time without notice.
- The ETF's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the ETF's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the ETF's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the ETF in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the ETF. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the ETF is less than one year old.
