Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 11, 2022

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2022 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series PW and Series LW securities returned -11.1% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of -10.9% for a blended index composed of a 50% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the MSCI World (Net) Index (returned -13.0%), and a 50% weighting in the ICE BofA Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index (returned -8.8%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

A stronger U.S. dollar and high inflation contributed to economic weakness across many global economies over the period. Inflation rose above 10% in some European economies as the region faced a worsening energy crisis, and many central banks raised their policy rates. China's growth slowed in response to its ongoing "zero COVID-19" policy. Volatility remained heightened in most Group of Ten ("G10") fixed income markets, while moderating economic indicators and expectations of higher interest rates put downward pressure on equity markets.

Within the MSCI World (Net) Index, Portugal, Finland and Hong Kong were the strongest-performing markets in Canadian dollar terms, while Austria, Germany and Sweden were the weakest. The energy, consumer staples and health care sectors were the strongest performers, while communication services, information technology and materials were the weakest.

The following discussion reflects the Fund's allocation decisions and the activities and performance of its underlying investment funds and other directly held securities. The Fund outperformed the broad-based index because of its allocation to fixed income securities, which outperformed equities over the period. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund performed in line with the blended index, with the equity portfolio outperforming the equity portion of the blended index.

Within the equity portion of the Fund, stock selection in the United States and Canada contributed to performance relative to the blended index. In sector terms, stock selection in information technology and financials contributed to performance. Conversely, holdings in Taiwan detracted from performance, as did stock selection in the health care sector.

Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, holdings in term loans contributed to performance. Conversely, an underweight position in government bonds detracted from performance.

The Fund's foreign currency exposure is actively managed to help mitigate risk and take advantage of opportunities at the total portfolio level. During the period, currency activities detracted from performance.

Over the period, neither portfolio activity nor market developments significantly changed the positioning of the Fund.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets decreased by 21.5% during the period to \$90.2 million. This change was composed primarily of \$11.7 million in net losses (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$13.1 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2022, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2022. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The Mackenzie Multi-Asset Strategies team believes the risk of a hard-landing recession increased as major central banks raised interest rates to control inflation. Historically, an inverted government yield curve (with short-term yields higher than long-term yields) has been a reliable predictor of a recession in the next 12 to 18 months; late in the period, yield curves in the United States, Canada and the United Kingdom became more inverted. An externally driven energy crisis and high inflation have also increased recession risk in Europe, in the team's opinion. Though inflation appears to have peaked in many economies, in the short-to-medium term the team expects high and persistent inflation to pressure interest rates higher.

In the near term, the CBOE Volatility Index, or VIX Index, is significantly elevated, suggesting that larger-than-usual equity declines are statistically possible. The team believes increased volatility reflects worries that the cumulative impact of central bank tightening will slow global economic growth, lower earnings and weigh on equity valuations.

On May 20, 2022, underlying fund Mackenzie Global Tactical Investment Grade Bond Fund merged into Mackenzie Global Tactical Bond Fund, which replaced it in the Fund's portfolio.

On September 29, 2022, underlying fund Mackenzie Canadian Growth Fund was renamed Mackenzie Bluewater Canadian Growth Fund.

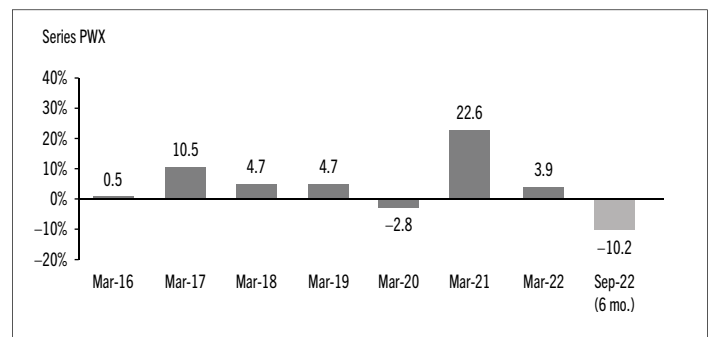
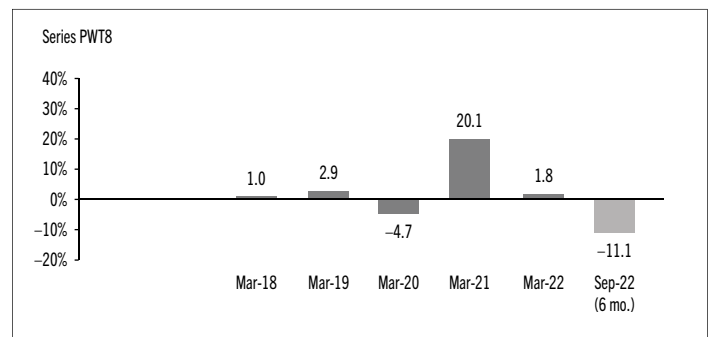
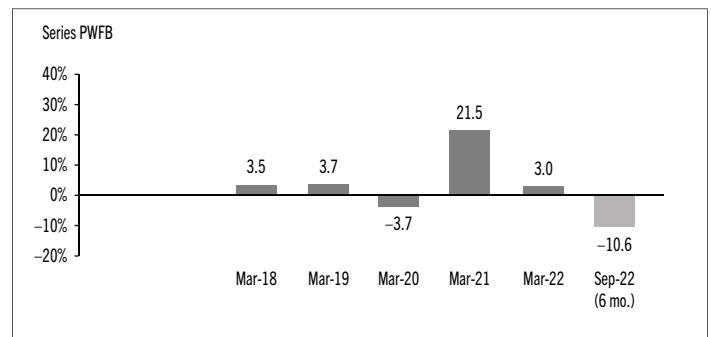
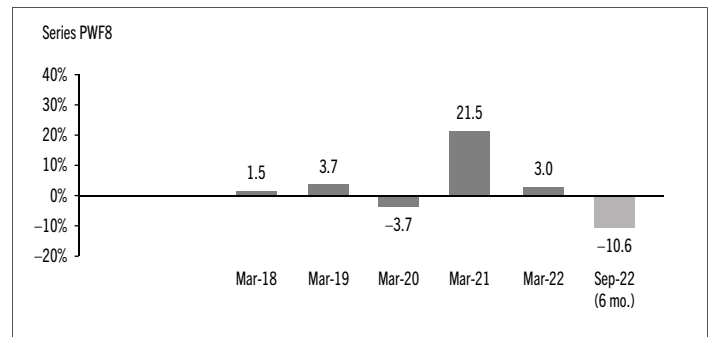
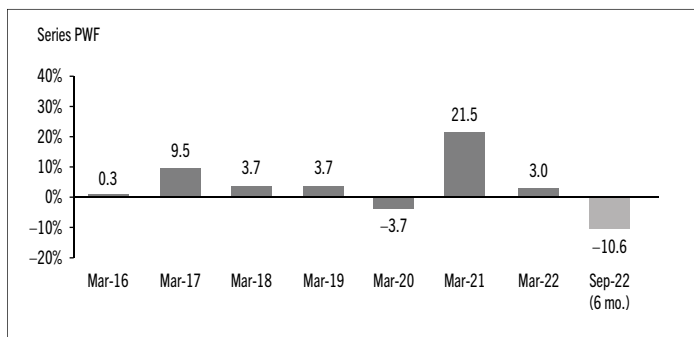
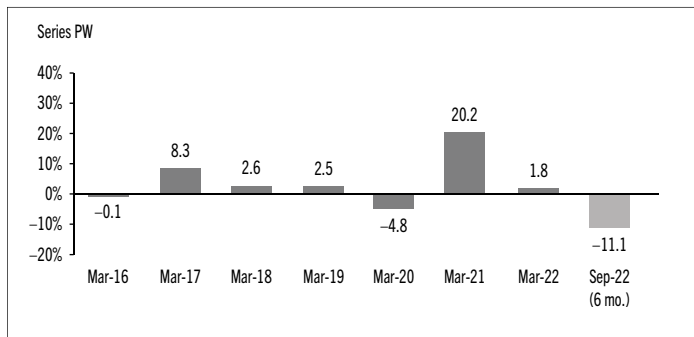
Other Related Party Transactions

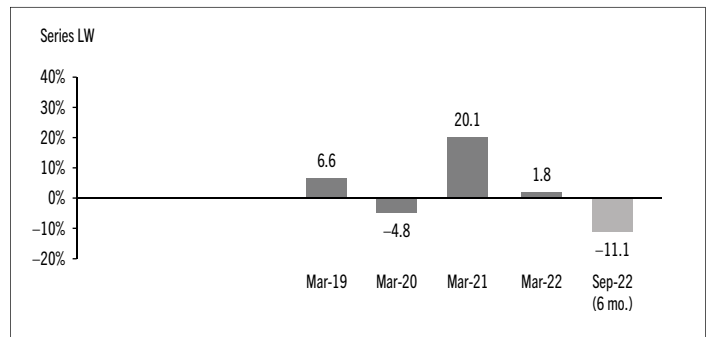
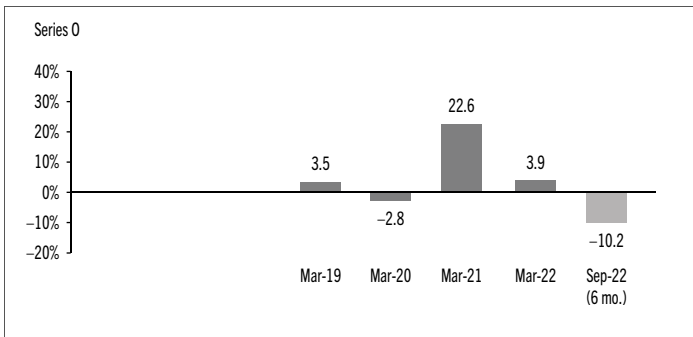
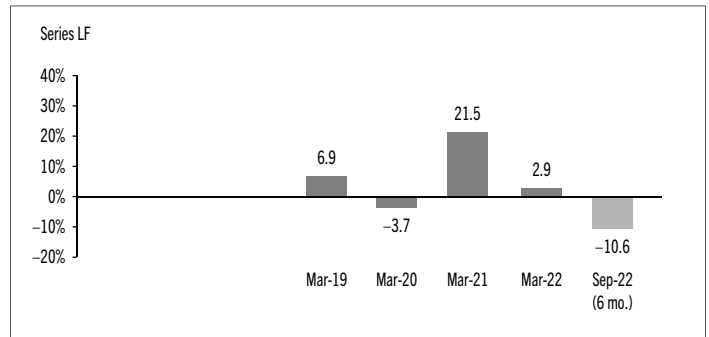
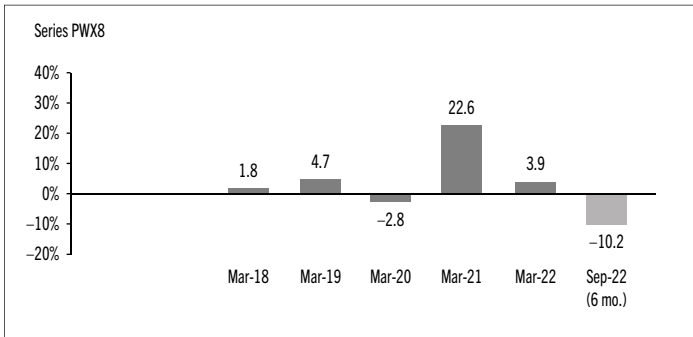
Past Performance

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

LBC Financial Services Inc. ("LBC") is the principal distributor for the LBC series securities of the Fund (as listed under *Fund Formation and Series Information*) and receives a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to the Manager. Under this arrangement, LBC was entitled to approximately 25% of the total management fees that the Manager received from the LBC series of all Mackenzie funds during the period. The Manager is responsible for paying all distribution-related payments to LBC-authorized dealers whose clients invest in the LBC series of the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 40% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.

Series PWF and Series PWF8 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$100,000. Investors in Series PWF and Series PWF8 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 4% or 8% per year, respectively.

Series PWFB securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWFB securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 4% per year.

Series PWX and Series PWX8 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWX and Series PWX8 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 4% or 8% per year, respectively.

Series O securities are offered only to investors investing a minimum of \$500,000 who are enrolled in Mackenzie Portfolio Architecture Service or Open Architecture Service; certain institutional investors; investors in a qualified group plan, and certain qualifying employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries. Investors in Series O securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 4% per year.

The sales charge under the sales charge purchase option is negotiated by the investor with their dealer. Securities purchased before June 1, 2022, under the redemption charge purchase option, low-load 3 purchase option and low-load 2 purchase option (collectively the "deferred sales charge purchase options") may continue to be held in investor accounts. Investors may switch from securities of a Mackenzie fund previously purchased under these deferred sales charge purchase options to securities of other Mackenzie funds, under the same purchase option, until such time as the redemption schedule has expired.
