Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 11, 2022

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2022 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series SC securities returned -9.2%, and Series LB securities returned -9.3% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with the ICE BofA Global Broad Market (Hedged) Index return of -8.8%. All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Volatility remained heightened across most Group of Ten ("G10") fixed income markets over the period. Inflation was persistently high in North America and Europe. It rose above 10% in some European economies, partly the result of a worsening energy crisis in the region. Both the U.S. Federal Reserve and the Bank of Canada increased their policy rates by 275 basis points, ending the period at 3.25%, while the European Central Bank raised its key policy rate by 125 basis points.

The Fund underperformed the index, with security selection among foreign government bonds detracting from performance. Within corporate bonds, security selection in the industrial sector detracted from performance. Conversely, security selection in the real estate sector contributed to performance, as did holdings in term loans.

The Fund held government bond futures to manage duration (sensitivity to interest rates), which contributed to performance.

Over the period, the portfolio management team increased the Fund's exposure to higher-quality investment grade corporate bonds because of uncertainty about the economy.

Environmental, Social and Governance ("ESG") Impact

The portfolio management team participated as co-lead investors in the Wildlife Conservation Bond ("WCB"). Known as the "rhino bond," the WCB is a sustainable bond, meaning it has a social and a green focus. A portion of the bond's returns are based on the rate of growth of black rhinoceros populations in South Africa's Addo Elephant National Park and the Great Fish River Nature Reserve. The bond will fund the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development's global portfolio of sustainable development projects.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets decreased by 0.6% during the period to \$49.2 million. This change was composed primarily of \$4.4 million in net losses (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$4.1 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2022, was generally similar to the MER for the period ended March 31, 2022. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MER for Series D decreased due to a decrease in the management fee rate effective April 4, 2022, as noted in the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of the report. The MER for Series PW decreased due to changes in its applicable Harmonized Sales Tax rate. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The portfolio management team expects elevated inflation to remain a dominant driver of market performance and central bank policy actions, although the team believes inflation may have peaked in the United States and Canada. In the team's view, aggressive policy rate increases by the Federal Reserve and the Bank of Canada to tame inflation will make it difficult to avoid a recession.

The ESG-labelled bond market has grown exponentially, driven by an increased focus on a sustainable future. The team continues to focus on both ESG-labelled bonds and best-in-class ESG issuers to maximize impact.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

Investment funds managed by Mackenzie and its affiliates may invest in the Fund. All these investments are made on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At September 30, 2022, funds managed by Mackenzie owned 78.3% of the Fund's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day. As a result of these investments, the Fund may be subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions.

At September 30, 2022, Mackenzie had an investment of \$0.01 million in the Fund (less than 0.1% of the Fund's NAV).

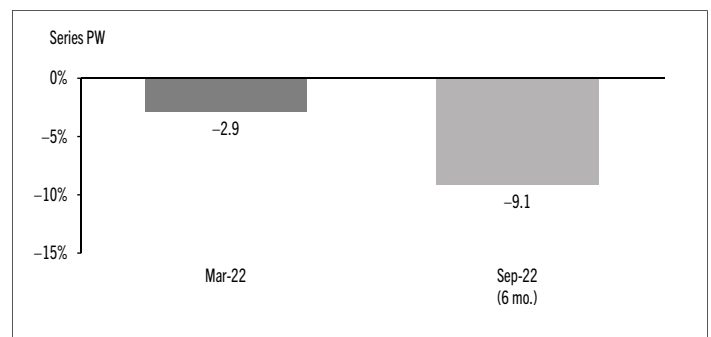
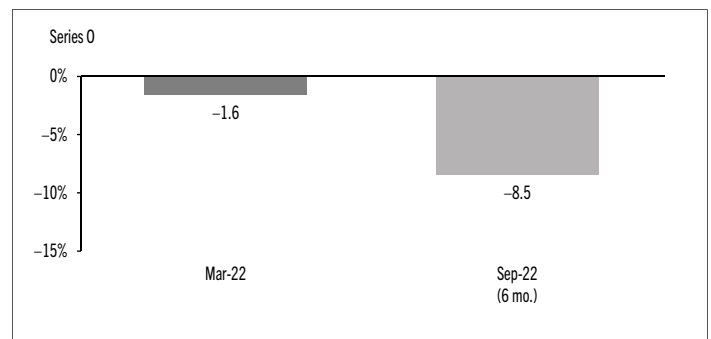
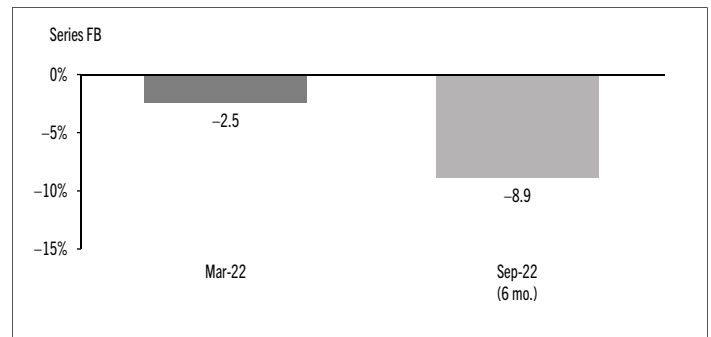
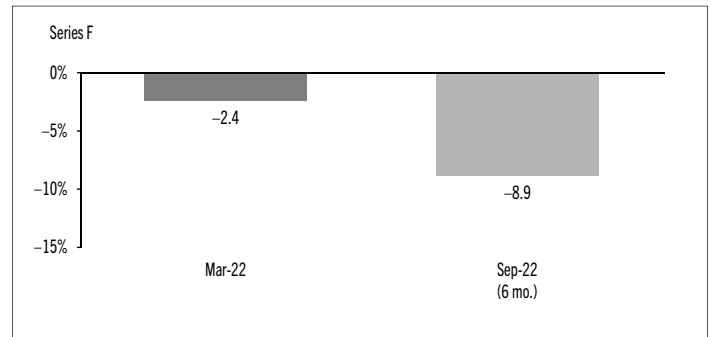
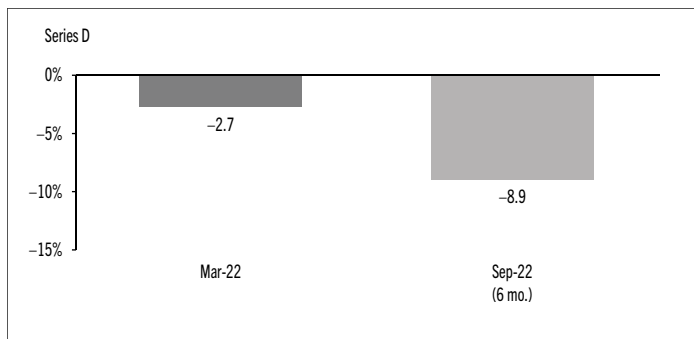
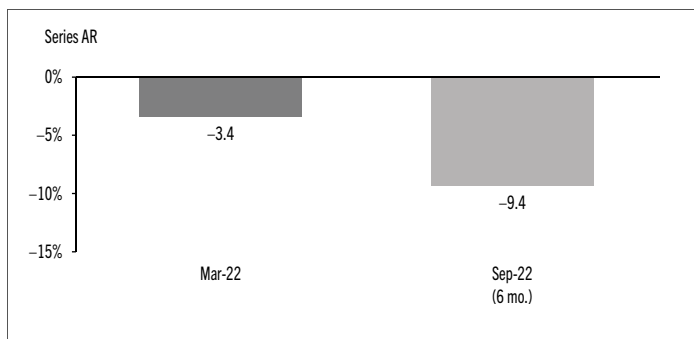
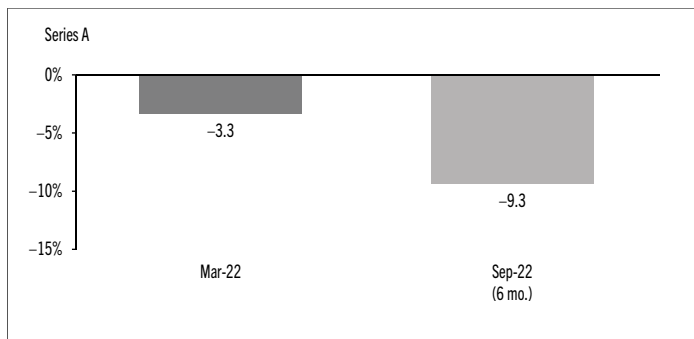
The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

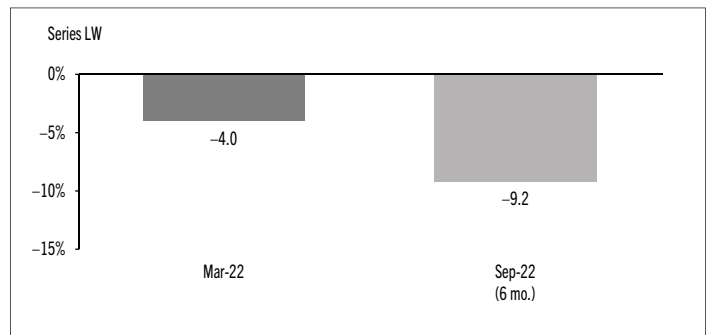
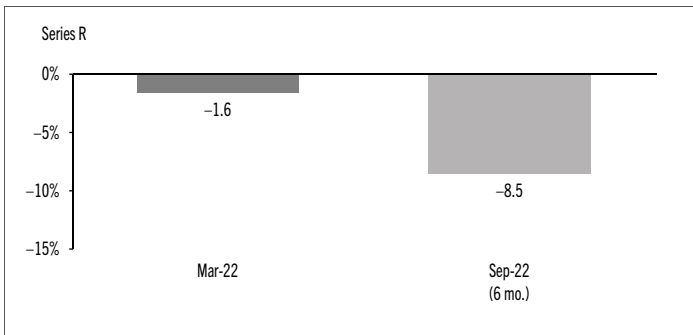
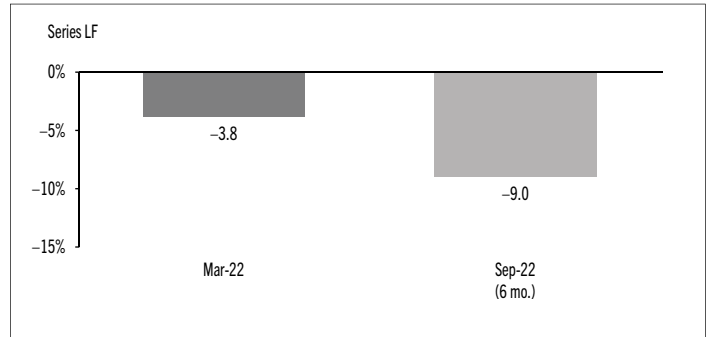
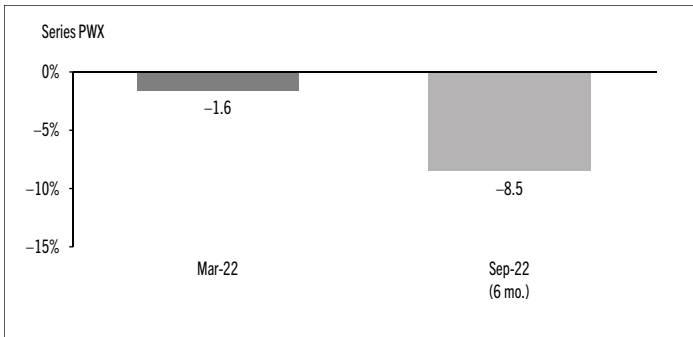
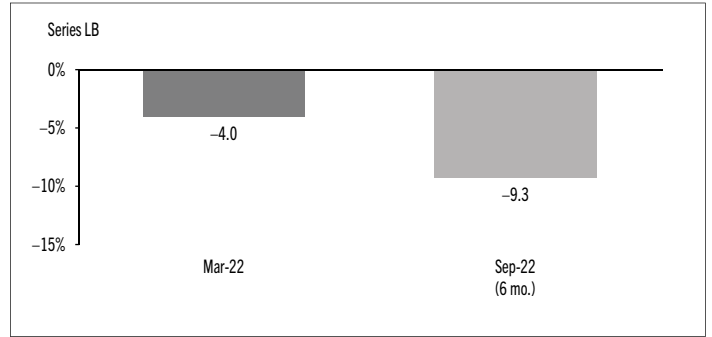
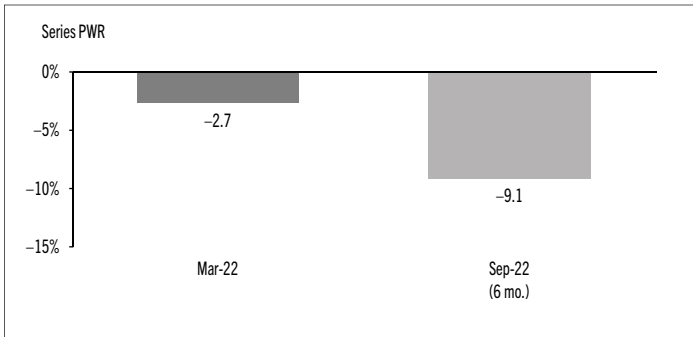
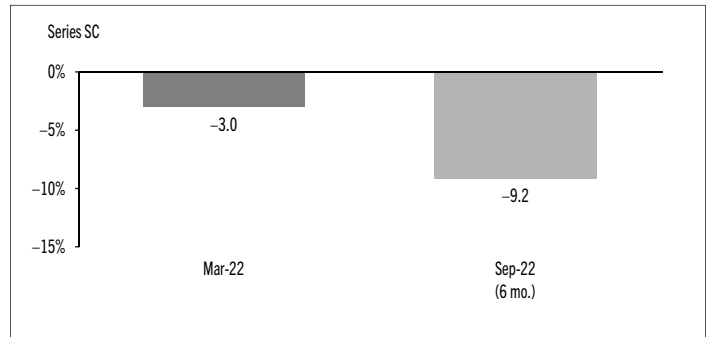
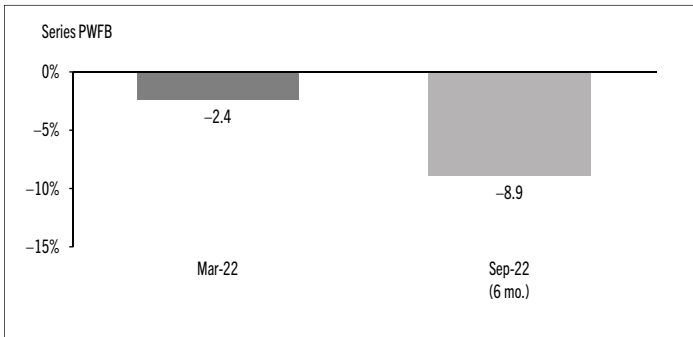
Past Performance

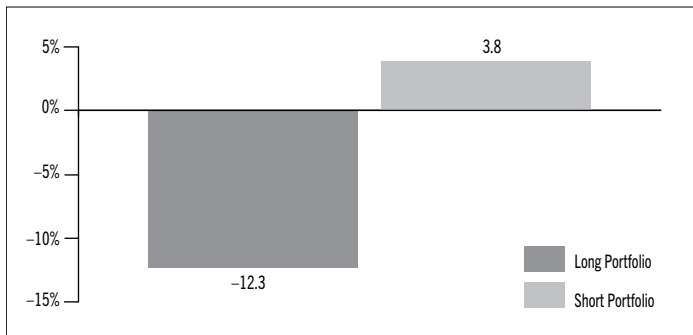

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

LBC Financial Services Inc. ("LBC") is the principal distributor for the LBC series securities of the Fund (as listed under *Fund Formation and Series Information*) and receives a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to the Manager. Under this arrangement, LBC was entitled to approximately 25% of the total management fees that the Manager received from the LBC series of all Mackenzie funds during the period. The Manager is responsible for paying all distribution-related payments to LBC-authorized dealers whose clients invest in the LBC series of the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 14% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.

Series FB securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor.

Series O securities are offered only to investors investing a minimum of \$500,000 who are enrolled in Mackenzie Portfolio Architecture Service or Open Architecture Service, certain institutional investors, investors in a qualified group plan, and certain qualifying employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries.

Series PW securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000.

Series PWFB securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor.

Series PWR securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000 in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie.

Series PWX securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor.

Series R securities are offered only to other affiliated funds and certain institutional investors in connection with fund-of-fund arrangements.
