## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 11, 2022

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2022 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

## Results of Operations

### Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series A securities returned -1.0% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of -2.8% for a blended index composed of a 70% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the Bloomberg China Treasury + Policy Bank Index (returned 1.0%), and a 30% weighting in the Bloomberg Asia Ex-Japan USD Credit China High Yield Index (returned -11.9%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

The Chinese economy slowed over the period in response to pandemic-related lockdowns, geopolitical uncertainty and worsening housing market conditions. Policy stimulus increased, including interest rate cuts and a doubling of the size of infrastructure investment funds. Chinese government bonds performed relatively well, as 10-year yields fell slightly while those in developed economies rose substantially. The offshore Chinese high-yield U.S. dollar bond market, which is dominated by real estate developers, declined as Chinese property firms experienced weaker earnings and tighter liquidity.

The Fund underperformed the broad-based index because of its exposure to high-yield bonds as spreads (the difference in yield between corporate bonds and government bonds of similar maturities) widened over the period. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund outperformed the blended index, with exposure to U.S. dollar-denominated corporate bonds in the industrial sector contributing to performance. Overweight exposure to longer-term government bonds also contributed to performance.

Conversely, underweight exposure to local government financing vehicle ("LGFV") bonds detracted from performance.

Hedging of foreign currency exposure detracted from performance as a result of the overall appreciation of the hedged currencies relative to the Canadian dollar.

Over the period, the Fund's cash position decreased, and exposure to Chinese corporate bonds increased, based on improved valuations.

## Net Assets

The Fund's net assets decreased by 0.8% during the period to \$20.0 million. This change was composed primarily of \$0.2 million in net losses (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses.

## Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2022, was generally similar to the annualized MER for the period ended March 31, 2022. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MER for Series D decreased due to a decrease in the management fee rate effective April 4, 2022, as noted in the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of the report. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

## Recent Developments

The portfolio management team believes that although China's gross domestic product growth and corporate earnings ended the period on a stronger footing, the recovery was shallow and consumer demand remained muted. Policies to restore property market confidence included planned credit enhancement for developers and for stalled projects, using central bank supports such as lower mortgage rates for primary residence purchases. Against this backdrop, the team expects market sentiment may improve in anticipation that the announced policy supports may be executed more speedily following the 20th National Congress of the Chinese Communist Party.

## Related Party Transactions

### Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

### Other Related Party Transactions

Investment funds managed by Mackenzie and its affiliates may invest in the Fund. All these investments are made on a prospectus-exempt basis in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At September 30, 2022, funds managed by Mackenzie owned 7.1% of the Fund's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the NAV per security on each transaction day. As a result of these investments, the Fund may be subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions.

At September 30, 2022, Mackenzie had an investment of \$18.1 million in the Fund (90.5% of the Fund's NAV). If the Manager decides to redeem its investment, it will do so in a manner that reduces the possibility of adverse effects on the Fund.

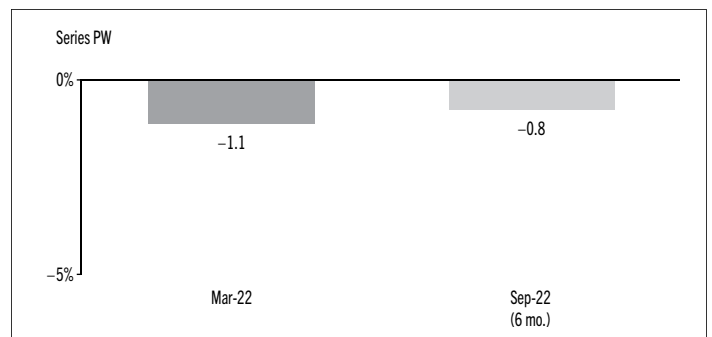
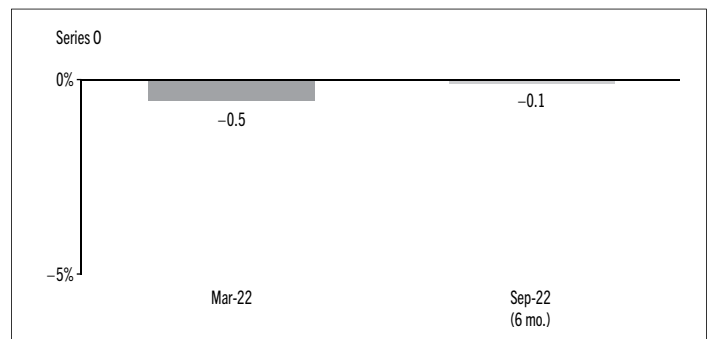
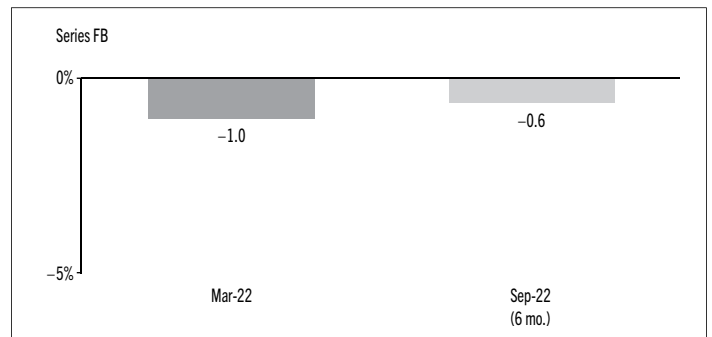
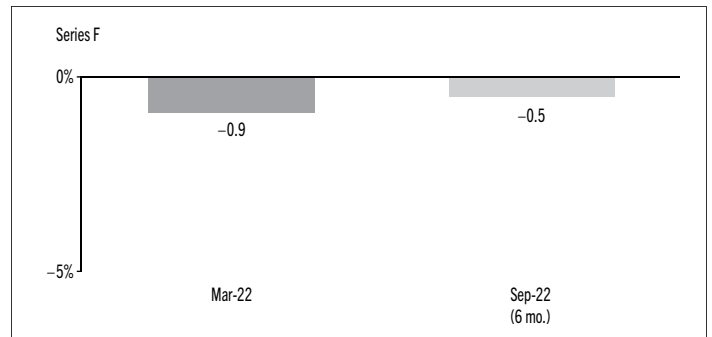
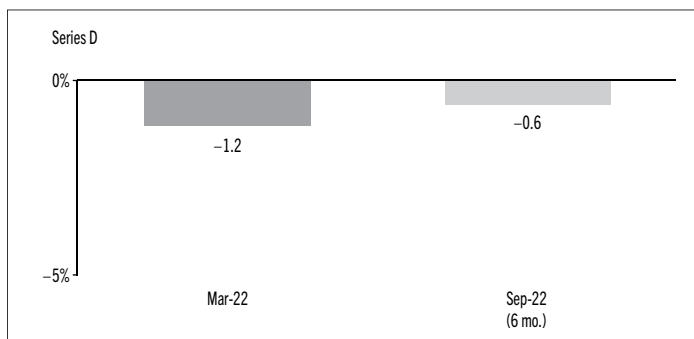
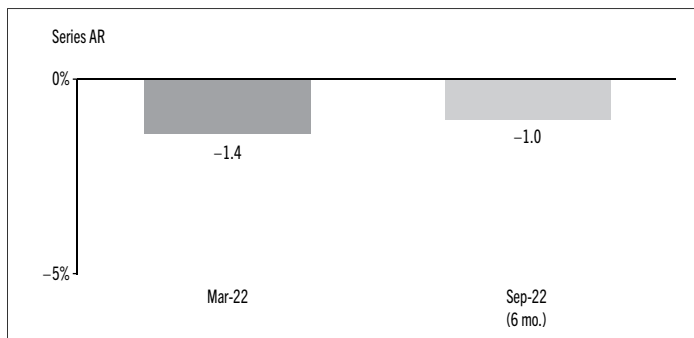
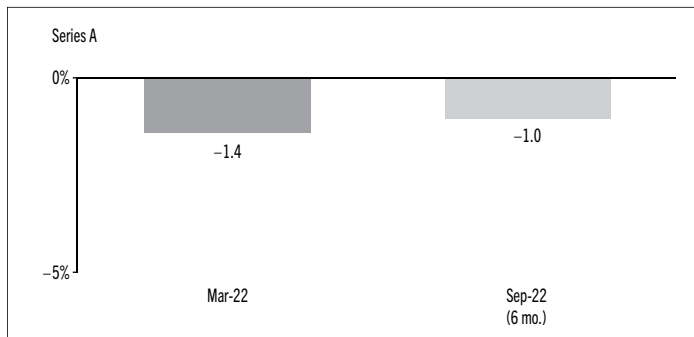
The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

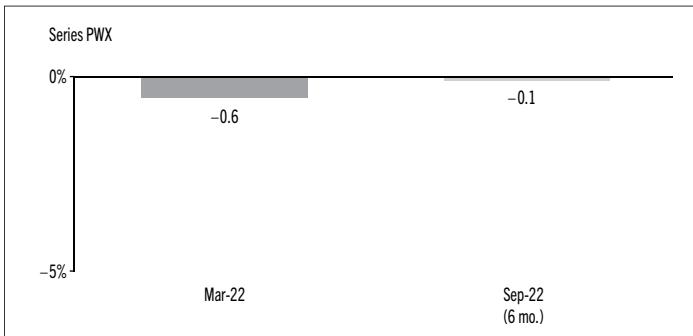
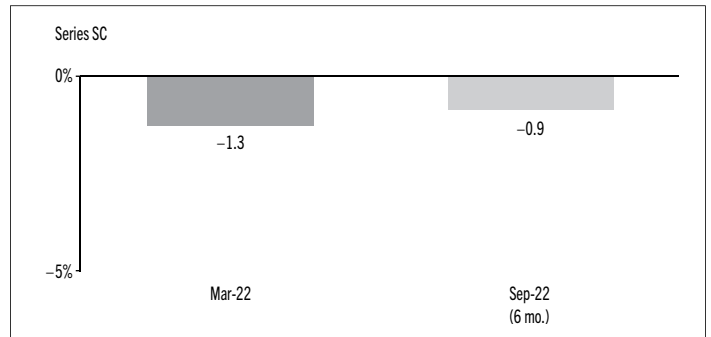
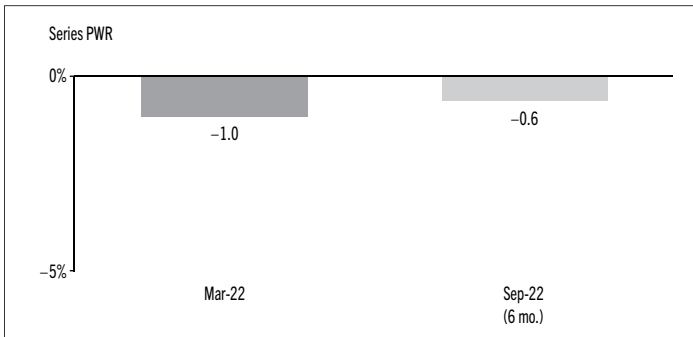
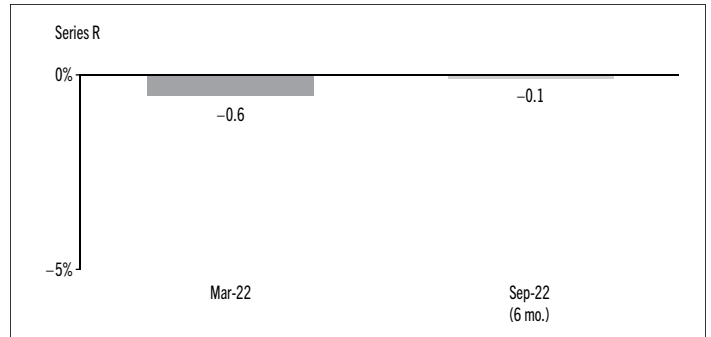
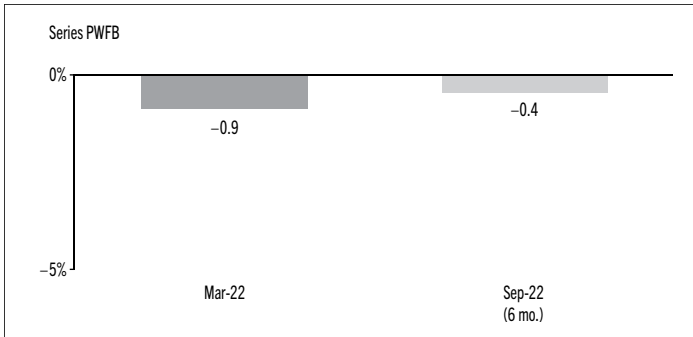
## Past Performance

Where the Fund directly invests in securities of another fund (including exchange-traded funds or "ETFs"), the MERs presented for the Fund include the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.

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## Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by Mackenzie in part to pay China Asset Management Company Limited, an affiliate of the Manager, for investment advisory services, including managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions and making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 14% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series.

Series D securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500 through a discount brokerage or other account approved by Mackenzie.

Series F securities are offered to retail investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$500; they are also available to employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries, and directors of Mackenzie.

Series FB securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor.

Series PWR securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000 in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie.

Series PWX securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor.

Series R securities are offered only to other funds managed by Mackenzie on a non-prospectus basis in connection with fund-of-fund arrangements.

Series SC securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500 under the sales charge purchase option.
