Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 11, 2022

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2022 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series A securities returned -9.3%, and Series LB securities returned -9.4% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of -7.1% for a blended index composed of a 59% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the S&P 500 Index (returned -11.7%), a 34% weighting in the FTSE Canada 91-Day T-Bill Index (returned 0.7%) and a 7% weighting in the FTSE Canada Universe All Government Bond Index (returned -5.4%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Inflation was persistently high in North America and Europe over the period. Both the U.S. Federal Reserve and the Bank of Canada increased their policy rates by 275 basis points, ending the period at 3.25%, while the European Central Bank raised its key policy rate by 125 basis points. Volatility remained heightened across most Group of Ten ("G10") fixed income markets, while U.S. equity market indices fell to new lows in September as the Federal Reserve set the stage for further increases in its federal funds rate.

Within the S&P 500 Index, energy, utilities and health care were the strongest sectors in Canadian dollar terms, while communication services, information technology and real estate were the weakest.

The following discussion reflects the Fund's allocation decisions and the activities and performance of its underlying investment funds and other directly held securities. The Fund outperformed the broad-based index because of its allocation to fixed income securities, which outperformed equities over the period. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

The Fund underperformed the blended index, with its underweight exposure to treasury bills detracting from performance.

Within the equity portion of the Fund, underweight exposure to the health care sector and stock selection in energy detracted from performance. At the country level, holdings in Israel detracted from performance. Conversely, underweight exposure to the information technology and communication services sectors contributed to performance.

Within the fixed income portion of the Fund, an underweight position in longer-duration government bonds, which have higher sensitivity to interest rates, contributed to performance. Holdings in longer-duration corporate bonds and term loans also contributed to performance.

Hedging of foreign currency exposure detracted from performance as a result of the overall appreciation of the hedged currencies relative to the Canadian dollar.

The Fund has exposure to purchased put options and written call options on the S&P 500 Index with the intention of reducing volatility and helping to protect the Fund from the impact of market declines, which contributed to performance. The Fund has exposure to put options on a high-yield bond exchange-traded fund to mitigate credit risk, which contributed to performance. The Fund also has exposure to government bond futures to manage duration (sensitivity to interest rates), which contributed to performance.

Over the period, neither portfolio activity nor market developments significantly changed the positioning of the Fund.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets increased by 130.5% during the period to \$32.0 million. This change was composed primarily of \$2.3 million in net losses (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$20.4 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2022, was generally similar to the annualized MER for the period ended March 31, 2022. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MER for Series D decreased due to a decrease in the management fee rate effective April 4, 2022, as noted in the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of the report. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

Recent Developments

The Mackenzie Multi-Asset Strategies team believes the risk of a hard-landing recession increased as major central banks raised interest rates to control inflation. Historically, an inverted government yield curve (with short-term yields higher than long-term yields) has been a reliable predictor of a recession in the next 12 to 18 months; late in the period, yield curves in the United States, Canada and the United Kingdom became more inverted. An externally driven energy crisis and high inflation have also increased recession risk in Europe, in the team's opinion. Though inflation appears to have peaked in many economies, in the short-to-medium term the team expects high and persistent inflation to pressure interest rates higher.

In the near term, the CBOE Volatility Index, or VIX Index, is significantly elevated, suggesting that larger-than-usual equity declines are statistically possible. The team believes increased volatility reflects worries that the cumulative impact of central bank tightening will slow global economic growth, lower earnings and weigh on equity valuations.

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

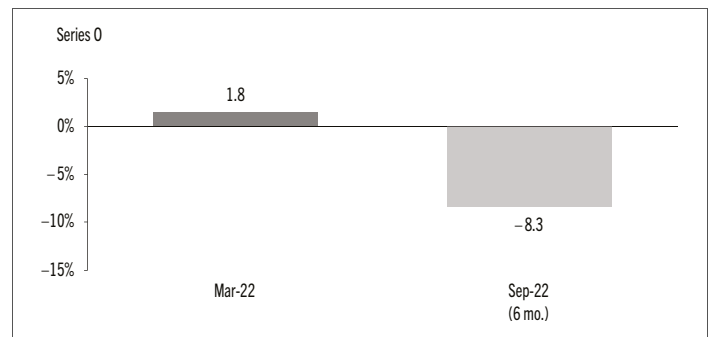
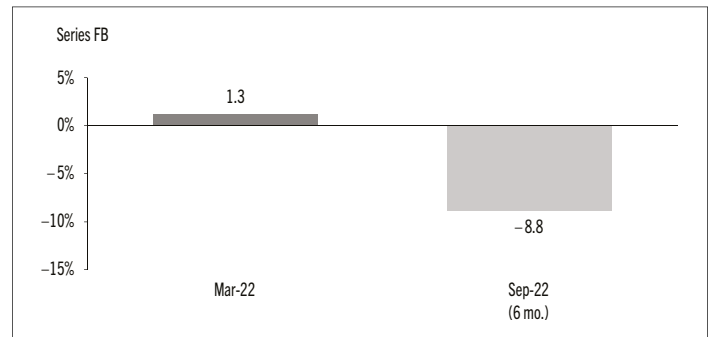
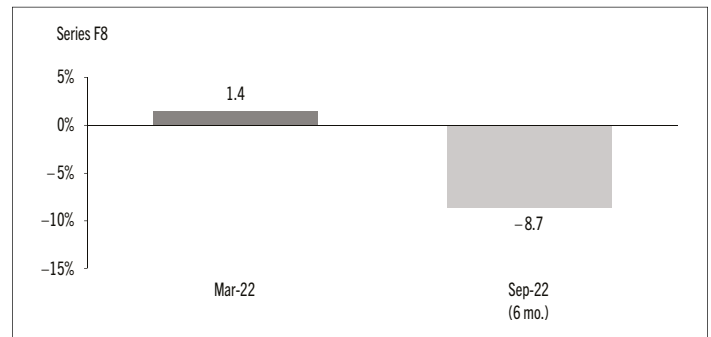
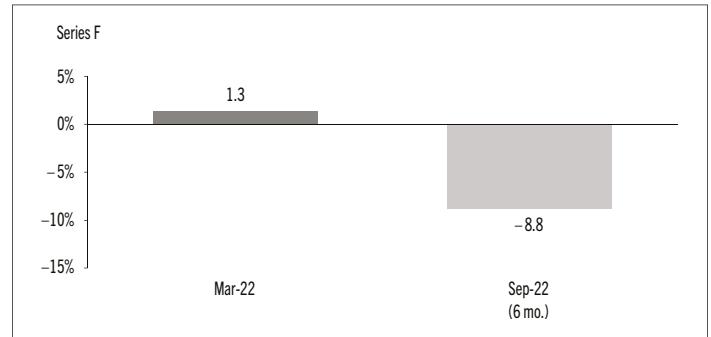
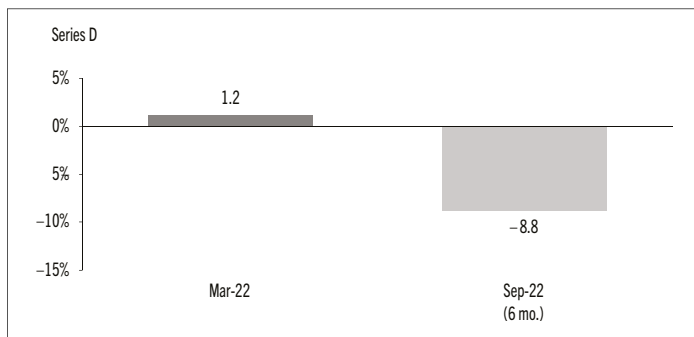
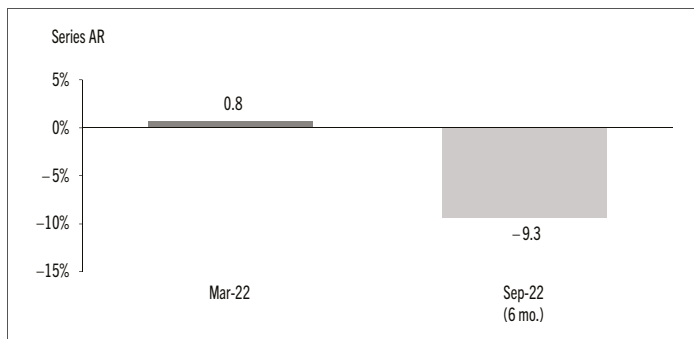
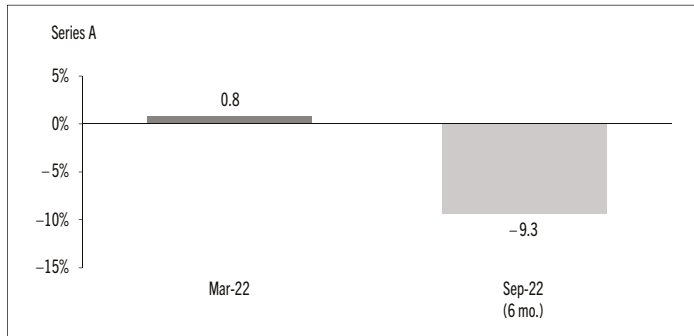
Other Related Party Transactions

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

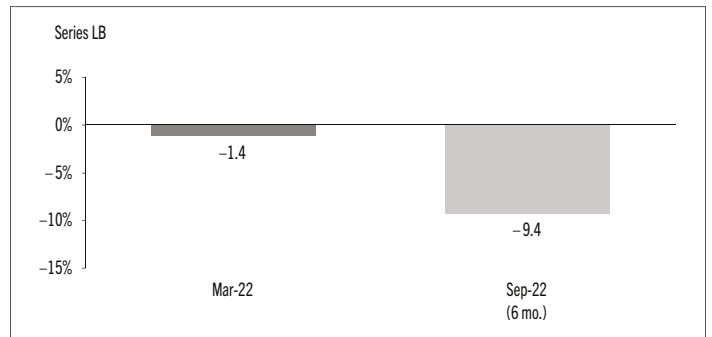
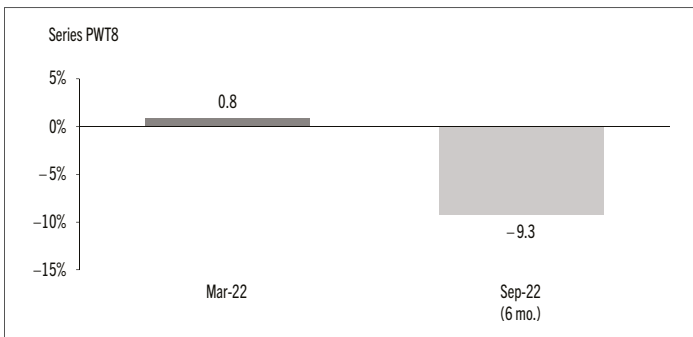
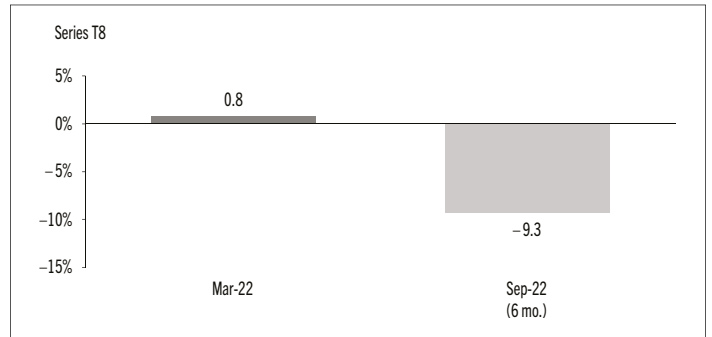
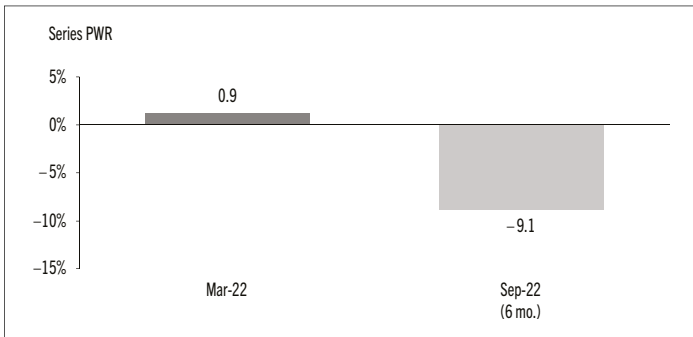
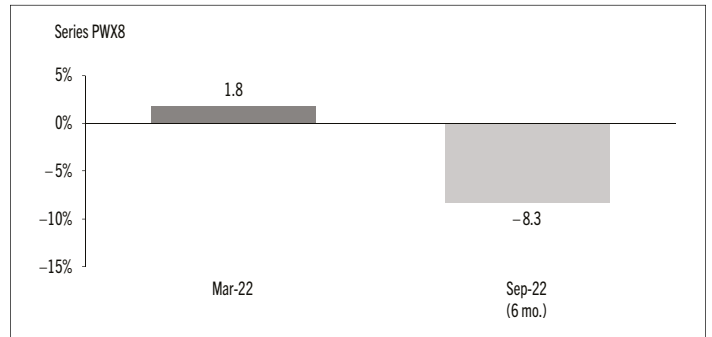
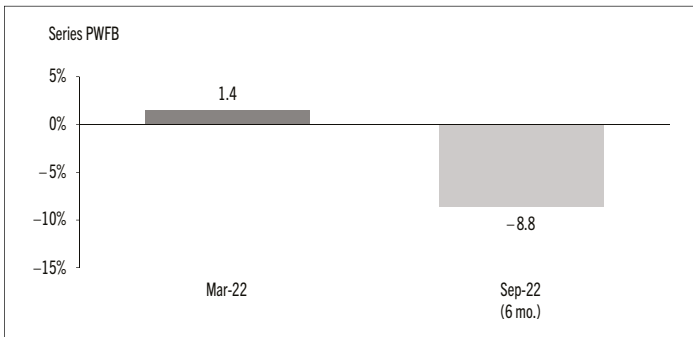
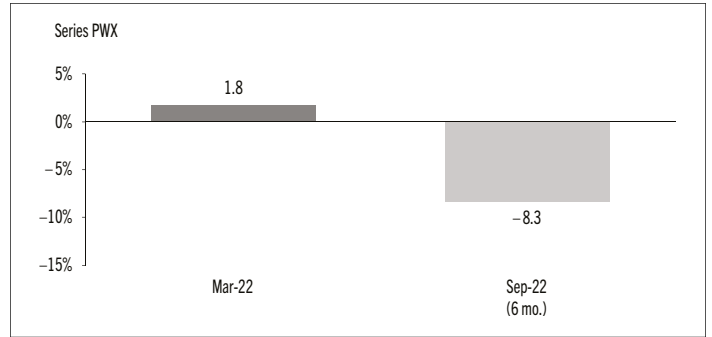
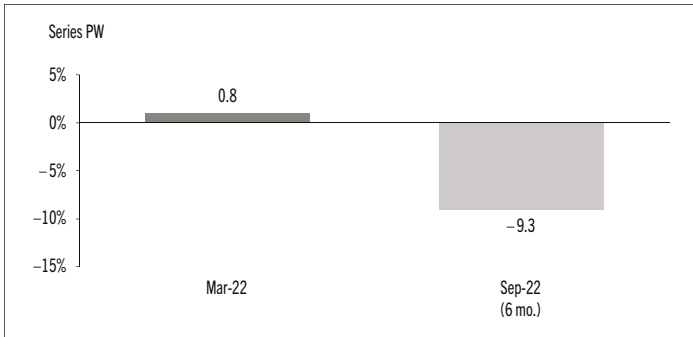
Past Performance

Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services. The Manager also used the management fees to fund sales commissions, trailing commissions and any other compensation (collectively "distribution-related payments") to registered dealers and brokers whose clients invest in the Fund.

LBC Financial Services Inc. ("LBC") is the principal distributor for the LBC series securities of the Fund (as listed under *Fund Formation and Series Information*) and receives a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to the Manager. Under this arrangement, LBC was entitled to approximately 25% of the total management fees that the Manager received from the LBC series of all Mackenzie funds during the period. The Manager is responsible for paying all distribution-related payments to LBC-authorized dealers whose clients invest in the LBC series of the Fund.

The following dealers affiliated with the Manager may be entitled to distribution-related payments from the Manager on the same basis as unrelated registered brokers and dealers: IPC Securities Corporation, Investors Group Securities Inc., IPC Investment Corporation and Investors Group Financial Services Inc.

The Manager used approximately 42% of the total management fee revenues received from all Mackenzie funds during the period to fund distribution-related payments to registered dealers and brokers. In comparison, such distribution-related payments for the Fund represented on average 45% of the management fees paid by all applicable series of the Fund during the period. The actual percentage for each series may be higher or lower than the average depending on the level of trailing commissions and sales commissions paid for that series. The higher proportion of distribution-related payments is primarily attributable to sales commissions related to gross sales of redemption charge securities of the Fund.

Series AR securities are offered to retail investors in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie. Investors in Series AR securities also want to receive a variable monthly cash distribution.

Series D securities are offered to retail investors investing a minimum of \$500 through a discount brokerage or other account approved by Mackenzie. Investors in Series D securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 4% per year.

Series F and Series F8 securities are offered to investors who are enrolled in a dealer-sponsored fee-for-service or wrap program, who are subject to an asset-based fee rather than commissions on each transaction and who invest at least \$500 (\$5,000 for Series F8); they are also available to employees of Mackenzie and its subsidiaries, and directors of Mackenzie. Series PWR securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000 in a Registered Disability Savings Plan offered by Mackenzie. Investors in Series PWR securities also want to receive a variable monthly cash distribution.

Series PWX and Series PWX8 securities are offered through our Private Wealth Solutions to certain high net worth investors who invest a minimum of \$100,000. Investors are required to negotiate their advisor service fee, which cannot exceed 1.50%, with their financial advisor. Investors in Series PWX and Series PWX8 securities also want to receive a monthly cash flow of 4% or 8% per year, respectively.
