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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 12, 2024

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2024 (the "period"). If the Fund was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the Fund. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the Fund as calculated for transaction purposes, on which the discussion of Fund performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

The performance of all series in the current and previous periods is shown in the *Past Performance* section of the report. Performance will vary by series primarily because fees and expenses differ between series, or because securities of a series were not issued and outstanding for the entire reporting period. Please refer to the *Fund Formation and Series Information* section of this report for the varying management and administration fees payable by each series. The following comparison to market indices is intended to help investors understand the Fund's performance relative to the general performance of the markets. However, the Fund's mandate may be different from that of the indices shown.

During the period, the Fund's Series PA securities returned 12.2% (after deducting fees and expenses paid by the series). This compares with a return of 9.6% for a blended index composed of a 60% weighting in the Fund's broad-based index, the S&P/TSX Composite Index (returned 10.0%), and a 40% weighting in the MSCI World (Net) Index (returned 9.0%). All index and series returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equity markets generally rose over the period as most central banks began to cut interest rates. Share prices increased in relation to corporate earnings, with gains in U.S. markets driven mainly by a small number of mega-capitalization stocks. The global economy was resilient as inflation continued to slow across most major markets, although unemployment moved slightly higher. Canadian equities rose despite volatility, with the financials sector and mining stocks leading market performance. In response to weak economic data and falling inflation, the Bank of Canada cut its policy rate in June, July and September.

Within the S&P/TSX Composite Index, materials, utilities and financials were the best-performing sectors, while health care, industrials and energy were the weakest.

Within the MSCI World (Net) Index, Asia Pacific (ex Japan) and North America were the best-performing regions in Canadian dollar terms, while Japan, Europe, and Africa and the Middle East were the weakest. The utilities, information technology and real estate sectors were the strongest performers, while energy, consumer discretionary and health care were the weakest.

The following discussion reflects the Fund's allocation decisions and the activities and performance of its underlying investment funds and other directly held securities. The Fund outperformed both the broad-based index and the blended index, with lack of exposure to the energy sector and stock selection in the industrials sector contributing to performance. Conversely, stock selection in the communication services sector detracted from performance relative to both indices.

Relative to the broad-based index, stock selection in the materials sector also detracted from performance. Given the Fund's mandate, the return of the blended index is a more meaningful comparison.

Relative to the blended index, stock selection in Canada contributed to performance.

Over the period, neither portfolio activity nor market developments significantly changed the positioning of the Fund.

Environmental, Social and Governance ("ESG") Impact

Engagement and stewardship are a primary part of the portfolio management team's philosophy. During the period, the team engaged with 16 companies held in the Fund on key themes such as climate change and emissions and good governance. For example, the team met with the management of WSP Global Inc., a Canadian-based global engineering and professional services firm, to discuss good governance practices and the company's proposal to increase the size of its board of directors to 15 members from 10.

The team's initial review highlighted that the proposed increase might result in an excessively large board relative to the number of committees chaired. Generally, the team believes that smaller boards are beneficial because there is higher accountability, quicker decision making and less likelihood of groupthink. The team requested a conversation with management in order to better understand the rationale for the change. After learning about management's goals for succession planning and securing talent with complementary skills to ensure strong oversight of a rapidly growing global firm, the team became comfortable with the decision.

During the period, the team eliminated the position in The Toronto-Dominion Bank, anticipating potential reputational and financial damage to the bank with respect to failure to maintain an appropriate anti-money laundering compliance program in the United States. This assessment proved correct when TD Bank N.A. and parent company TD Bank Holding Company pleaded guilty to violations of the Bank Secrecy Act and money laundering, and the U.S. Department of Justice levied a significant fine. As a result, the team reallocated the portfolio's exposure to other Canadian banks, including a new position in National Bank of Canada.

The team also sold the position in Brookfield Renewable Partners LP because of its controlling interest in nuclear power company Westinghouse Electric Company LLC and Mackenzie's policy excluding companies involved in nuclear weapons production from sustainable investment funds. In 2023, Brookfield Renewable Partners LP acquired a 51% interest in nuclear power company Westinghouse in a joint partnership. Research by the Mackenzie Sustainability team as well as Morningstar Sustainalytics subsequently found that Westinghouse is involved in nuclear weapons activity. Brookfield Renewable Partners is considered to be involved through corporate ownership and was divested.

Net Assets

The Fund's net assets increased by 39.8% during the period to \$4.3 million. This change was composed primarily of \$0.5 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$0.8 million due to net securityholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Fees and Expenses

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for each series during the period ended September 30, 2024, was generally similar to the MER for the year ended March 31, 2024. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in each series. The MERs for all series are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report.

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Recent Developments

In the portfolio management team's view, moderating inflation and strong macroeconomic data support the return to more accommodative monetary policy in the United States. In contrast, the team expects that estimates of economic activity in Canada may be lowered in response to weakening growth over the period. In the team's opinion, the Canadian economy is more sensitive to changes in interest rates than that of the United States, and the Bank of Canada is likely to continue reducing rates more aggressively than the U.S. Federal Reserve. The team views this as a benefit for the financials sector, particularly within banking.

The following changes to the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee occurred:

- effective September 13, 2023, Saijal Patel was appointed;
- effective March 5, 2024, Atul Tiwari resigned; and
- effective April 30, 2024, the terms for Robert Hines and George Hucal expired, and Rebecca Cowdery was appointed.

Related Party Transactions

Management and Administration Services

For each applicable series, the Fund paid management fees and administration fees to the Manager at the annual rates specified under *Fund Formation and Series Information* in this report and as more fully described in the Prospectus. In return for the administration fees, the Manager pays all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs) required to operate the Fund that are not included in management fees. See also *Management Fees*.

Other Related Party Transactions

The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

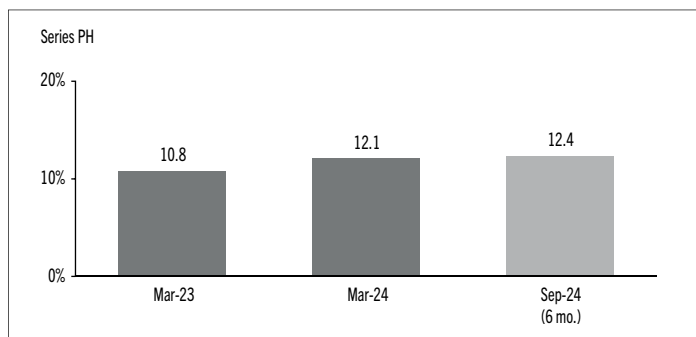
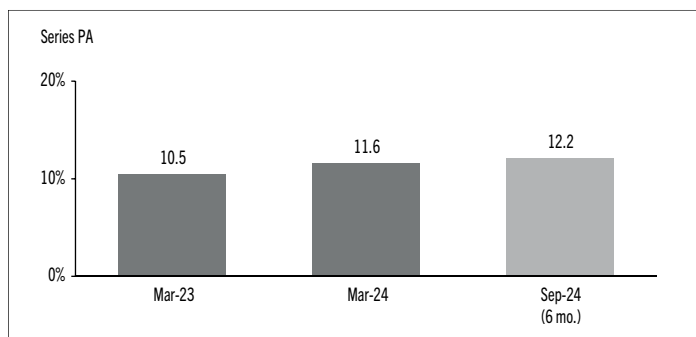
Past Performance

The Fund's performance information assumes all distributions made by the Fund in the periods presented are reinvested in additional securities of the relevant series of the Fund. The performance information does not take into account sales, redemption, distribution or other optional charges, or income taxes payable by any investor that would have reduced returns or performance. (2) Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, income taxes and withholding taxes, for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period, except as noted. In the period a series is established, the MER is annualized from the date of inception to the end of the period. Where the Fund directly invests in securities of another fund (including exchange-traded funds or "ETFs"), the MERs presented for the Fund include the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.

(3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the Fund invests in securities of another fund (including ETFs), the TERs presented for the Fund include the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment.

(4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the Fund is less than one year old. The value of any trades to realign the Fund's portfolio after a fund merger, if any, is excluded from the portfolio turnover rate.

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Management Fees

The management fee for each applicable series is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The Fund's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the Fund and/or the underlying fund(s), as applicable, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio, and providing other services.

PFSL Investments Canada Ltd. ("PFSL") is the principal distributor of the Fund and receives a portion of the management fees that the Fund pays to the Manager. The proportion of the management fees paid to PFSL increases, up to a maximum amount of 65%, as the assets of the Mackenzie FuturePath Funds increase. In addition to the exclusivity granted to the Manager with respect to the distribution of the Mackenzie FuturePath Funds by PFSL, other services provided to the Mackenzie FuturePath Funds and to the Manager by PFSL include: (1) participation in the initial design of the Mackenzie FuturePath Funds, such that they have been tailored to the clients of PFSL; (2) review and certification of the prospectus in PFSL's capacity as principal distributor; (3) participation in a joint fund oversight committee with the Manager to monitor the ongoing performance and development of the funds; (4) providing the Manager and its representatives greater access to the branch offices of PFSL to allow PFSL to appropriately market and make recommendations about the Mackenzie FuturePath Funds to its clients; (5) providing ongoing customized training to its representatives to allow them to gain full insight about the Mackenzie FuturePath Funds in order to provide suitable recommendations to its clients. PFSL is responsible for costs associated with distributing securities of the funds, including all administration costs ("distribution-related payments"). After all distribution-related payments have been made, PFSL retains any remaining amount.

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Fund Formation and Series Information

The Fund may have undergone a number of changes, such as a reorganization or a change in manager, mandate or name. A history of the major changes affecting the Fund in the last 10 years can be found in the Fund's Simplified Prospectus.
