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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 13, 2025

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the ETF's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2025 (the "period"). If the ETF was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the ETF. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the ETF as calculated for subscription and redemption purposes, on which the discussion of ETF performance is based.

Results of Operations

Investment Performance

During the period, the ETF returned 13.7% (after deducting fees and expenses). This compares with a return of 15.7% for the ETF's broad-based index, the MSCI World (Net) Index, and a return of 23.6% for the ETF's narrow index, the MSCI World Growth (Net) Index. All index returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Global equities performed well over the period as shares of U.S. mega-capitalization companies involved in artificial intelligence ("AI") reached new highs and the U.S. Federal Reserve and European Central Bank reduced policy interest rates. Continued AI investment, robust corporate earnings and a weakening U.S. dollar also supported global investor sentiment. Asian equity markets were driven by strength in technology and semiconductor-related stocks, while Chinese equities outperformed in response to aggressive monetary policy easing and expanded market access for foreign investors.

Within the MSCI World Growth (Net) Index, North America and Japan were the best-performing regions in Canadian dollar terms, while Africa and the Middle East and Europe were the weakest. The communication services, information technology and utilities sectors were the strongest performers, while health care, consumer staples and energy were the weakest.

The ETF underperformed both the broad-based index and the narrow index, with stock selection in the United States and an overweight position and stock selection in France detracting from performance. In sector terms, stock selection in information technology, financials and consumer discretionary detracted from performance. Conversely, holdings in Taiwan contributed to performance relative to both indices.

Relative to the broad-based index, stock selection in the Netherlands also contributed to performance, as did lack of exposure to the energy sector and underweight exposure to the consumer staples sector. Given the ETF's mandate, the return of the narrow index is a more meaningful comparison.

Relative to the narrow index, stock selection in the industrials sector also detracted from performance. Conversely, lack of exposure to the United Kingdom contributed to performance.

Over the period, the ETF's exposure to the information technology and communication services sectors increased, based on the portfolio management team's view on opportunities related to structural digitization of the global economy.

Net Assets

The ETF's net assets increased by 51.5% during the period to \$11.7 million. This change was composed primarily of \$1.3 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and an increase of \$2.6 million due to net unitholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

Recent Developments

In the portfolio management team's view, global equity market performance was somewhat paradoxical in the period. Renewed investor appetite for risk advanced the information technology and communication services sectors, while strong corporate earnings and enthusiasm around AI overwhelmed economic signals pointing to softening labour markets, rising household debt and persistent tariff uncertainty.

In this environment, the team's approach remained disciplined and balanced. The team positioned the ETF to reflect the structural digitization of the global economy, focusing on companies with sustained competitive advantages, strong fundamentals and sustainable free cash flow. The team complements selected positions in companies that facilitate or benefit from AI technologies with holdings in companies that have durable idiosyncratic advantages. This investment approach aims to benefit from attractive opportunities while managing risk and avoiding overconcentration on a single investment theme.

Related Party Transactions

Management Fees

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for the ETF during the period ended September 30, 2025, was similar to the annualized MER for the period ended March 31, 2025. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in the ETF. The MERs are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report. The ETF paid management fees to the Manager at the annual rate of 0.80%.

The management fee for the ETF is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The ETF's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the ETF, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio and providing other services, and to pay for all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs as more fully described in the Prospectus) required to operate the ETF.

Other Related Party Transactions

The ETF did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

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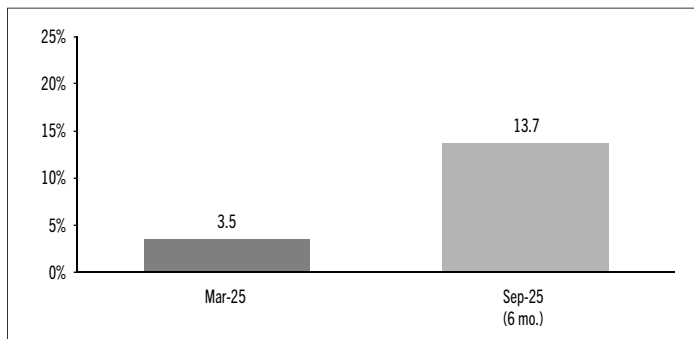
Past Performance

The ETF's performance information assumes all distributions made by the ETF in the periods presented are reinvested in additional units of the ETF. (2) Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, income taxes and withholding taxes, for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period, except as noted. If the ETF was established in the period, the MER is annualized from the date of inception to the end of the period. Where the ETF directly invests in securities of another fund (including other ETFs), the MER presented for the ETF includes the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.

(3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the ETF invests in securities of another fund (including other ETFs), the TER presented for the ETF includes the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. The Manager may reimburse the ETF for certain brokerage commissions and other transaction costs (including those payable to the custodian or its agents). The Manager may make these reimbursements at its discretion and stop these reimbursements at any time without notice.

(4) The ETF's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the ETF's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the ETF's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the ETF in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the ETF. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the ETF is less than one year old.

(5) Closing market price, or the midpoint of the bid and ask prices in the absence of a closing market price, on the last trading day of the period as reported on the Toronto Stock Exchange.
