# MACKENZIE CORE RESOURCES ETF

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## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

November 13, 2025

This Management Discussion of Fund Performance presents the portfolio management team's view on the significant factors and developments that have affected the ETF's performance and outlook in the six-month period ended September 30, 2025 (the "period"). If the ETF was established during the period, "period" represents the period since inception.

In this report, "Mackenzie" and "the Manager" refer to Mackenzie Financial Corporation, the manager of the ETF. In addition, net asset value ("NAV") refers to the value of the ETF as calculated for subscription and redemption purposes, on which the discussion of ETF performance is based.

## Results of Operations

### Investment Performance

During the period, the ETF returned 23.5% (after deducting fees and expenses). This compares with a return of 22.1% for the ETF's broad-based index, the S&P/TSX Composite Index, and a return of 29.6% for the ETF's narrow index, the S&P/TSX Energy and Materials Index. All index returns are calculated on a total return basis in Canadian dollar terms. Investors cannot invest in an index without incurring fees, expenses and commissions, which are not reflected in the index returns.

Crude oil prices were volatile and ended the period lower. The coalition of the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries and other oil-producing nations known as OPEC+ agreed to larger-than-expected crude production increases, while some members unwound their own previous production cuts. Geopolitical tensions also contributed to oil price fluctuations, as did slower economic growth in China and uncertainty related to U.S. tariff policies, which depressed demand. Gold prices reached record highs, driven by both investor and central bank purchases.

Within the S&P/TSX Energy and Materials Index, oil, gas and consumable fuels, metals and mining, and chemicals were the best-performing industries, while energy equipment and services, paper and forest products, and containers and packaging were the weakest.

The ETF outperformed the broad-based index, with overweight exposure to the materials sector and underweight exposure to the industrials sector contributing to performance. Conversely, an overweight position and stock selection in the energy sector and lack of exposure to the financials sector detracted from performance relative to the broad-based index. Given the ETF's mandate, the return of the narrow index is a more meaningful comparison.

The ETF underperformed the narrow index, with stock selection in the oil, gas and consumable fuels industry and the paper and forest products industry detracting from performance, along with overweight exposure to the chemicals industry. In geographic terms, holdings in the United States and France detracted from performance relative to the narrow index. Conversely, stock selection in the metals and mining industry contributed to performance.

The ETF held call options on the price of gold, which is an efficient way to gain exposure to the commodity. These options contributed to performance as gold prices rose.

Over the period, the ETF's exposure to the energy sector decreased, and exposure to the materials sector increased, based on the portfolio management team's assessment of valuations and opportunities, and as a result of market movements.

## Net Assets

The ETF's net assets decreased by 5.9% during the period to \$34.5 million. This change was composed primarily of \$7.8 million in net income (including any interest and/or dividend income) from investment performance, after deducting fees and expenses, and a decrease of \$10.0 million due to net unitholder activity (including sales, redemptions and cash distributions).

## Recent Developments

The portfolio management team believes the coming decade will see a focus on infrastructure rebuilding, relocation of company production operations and a materials-intensive clean energy transition. Recent tariff developments reinforce the team's view that companies will increasingly move overseas operations to their home countries in response to trade barriers. These trends should allow commodity prices to stabilize at higher levels than the market consensus at the end of the period. The team believes higher prices could increase equity valuations and enable companies to redeploy capital into their businesses. The team focuses on companies with strong and sustainable free cash flows while maintaining disciplined subsector allocations in the ETF, based on macroeconomic indicators and risk exposure management.

## Related Party Transactions

### Management Fees

The annualized management expense ratio ("MER") for the ETF during the period ended September 30, 2025, was similar to the annualized MER for the period ended March 31, 2025. Total expenses paid vary from period to period mainly as a result of changes in average assets in the ETF. The MERs are presented in the *Financial Highlights* section of this report. The ETF paid management fees to the Manager at the annual rate of 0.75%.

The management fee for the ETF is calculated and accrued daily as a percentage of its NAV. The ETF's management fees were used by the Manager to pay for the costs of managing the investment portfolio of the ETF, including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions, making brokerage arrangements for the purchase and sale of the investment portfolio and providing other services, and to pay for all costs and expenses (other than certain specified fund costs as more fully described in the Prospectus) required to operate the ETF.

### Other Related Party Transactions

Investment funds managed by Mackenzie and its affiliates may invest in the ETF in accordance with the investment objectives of those funds. At September 30, 2025, funds managed by I.G. Investment Management, Ltd. owned 69.9% of the ETF's NAV. All related party transactions are based on the current market price. As a result of these investments, the ETF may be subject to large transaction risk as discussed in the Prospectus. Mackenzie manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effects on the ETF or on its investors, through such processes as settling transactions in kind, charging creation and/or redemption fees for transactions settling in cash, and establishing appropriate order cut-off times for transactions.

The ETF did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Mackenzie Funds' Independent Review Committee with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

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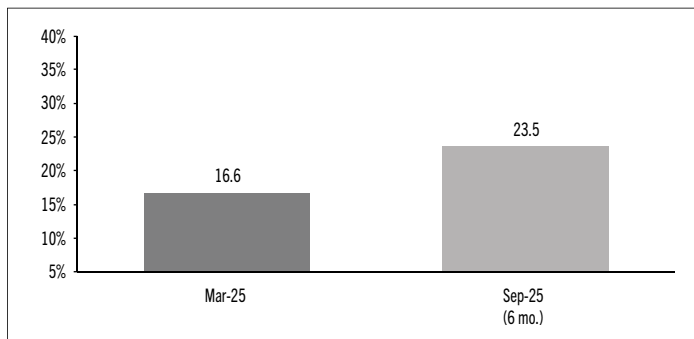
## Past Performance

(2) Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses, excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs, income taxes and withholding taxes, for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period, except as noted. If the ETF was established in the period, the MER is annualized from the date of inception to the end of the period. Where the ETF directly invests in securities of another fund (including other ETFs), the MER presented for the ETF includes the portion of MERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. Any income distributions received from ETFs managed by the Manager, with the intention of offsetting fees paid within those ETFs but which are not considered to be duplicative fees under regulatory requirements, are treated as waived expenses for MER purposes. The Manager may waive or absorb operating expenses at its discretion and stop waiving or absorbing such expenses at any time without notice.

(3) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs incurred as an annualized percentage of daily average net assets during the period. Where the ETF invests in securities of another fund (including other ETFs), the TER presented for the ETF includes the portion of TERs of the other fund(s) attributable to this investment. The Manager may reimburse the ETF for certain brokerage commissions and other transaction costs (including those payable to the custodian or its agents). The Manager may make these reimbursements at its discretion and stop these reimbursements at any time without notice.

(4) The ETF's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the ETF's portfolio advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher the ETF's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the ETF in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the ETF. The portfolio turnover rate is not provided when the ETF is less than one year old.

(5) Closing market price, or the midpoint of the bid and ask prices in the absence of a closing market price, on the last trading day of the period as reported on the Toronto Stock Exchange.
